1. Reference: Gender and Development Plan and Budget (GPB) 2025
2. The Gender and Development (GAD) Plan and Budget for Fiscal Year 2026 serves as the strategic blueprint for the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) to fully realize its commitment to Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment (GEWE). This document outlines the systematically designed programs, projects, and activities (PAPs), along with their corresponding financial allocation, aimed at addressing priority gender issues within the agency's mandate. Anchored on the principles of the Magna Carta of Women (Republic Act No. 9710), this plan adheres to the directive to allocate a minimum of five percent (5%) of the agency's total budget towards GAD initiatives.
3. The 2026 GAD Plan and Budget is utilized as a strategic planning tool for Gender Mainstreaming, ensuring that the concerns and experiences of both women and men are an integral dimension of the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of all PCSO policies, programs, and services.
4. This Plan is structured to address gender gaps through two main approaches:
 - ✦ Client-Focused Activities: Interventions that directly address the specific gender issues and needs of the PCSO's external stakeholders and beneficiaries, particularly those belonging to vulnerable or marginalized sectors.
 - ✦ Organization-Focused Activities: Initiatives designed to build the internal capacity of the PCSO including the Gender and Development Focal Point System (GFPS) and all personnel to effectively implement GAD mandates and institutionalize gender-responsive governance.
5. Crucially, GPB highlights the integration of gender perspectives into the agency's Major Final Outputs, particularly through the significant allocation of funds to GAD Attributable Programs, affirming that GAD is not merely a separate activity but a core element of the PCSO's entire operational mission.



6. The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office has exceeded the statutory minimum GAD budget allocation requirement for FY 2026. Based on the proposed financial allocation for FY 2026, the PCSO GAD budget is set at 8.67% of the total Corporate Operating Budget which is 3.67 percentage points higher than the non-negotiable legal threshold.
7. PCSO attributes its core and partner programs to the Gender and Development mandate by integrating gender-responsive perspectives into its services. This means that while the programs serve the general public, their design, implementation, and impact are assessed to ensure both women and men, particularly those from marginalized and vulnerable groups, benefit equitably.

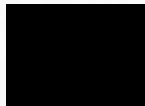
