



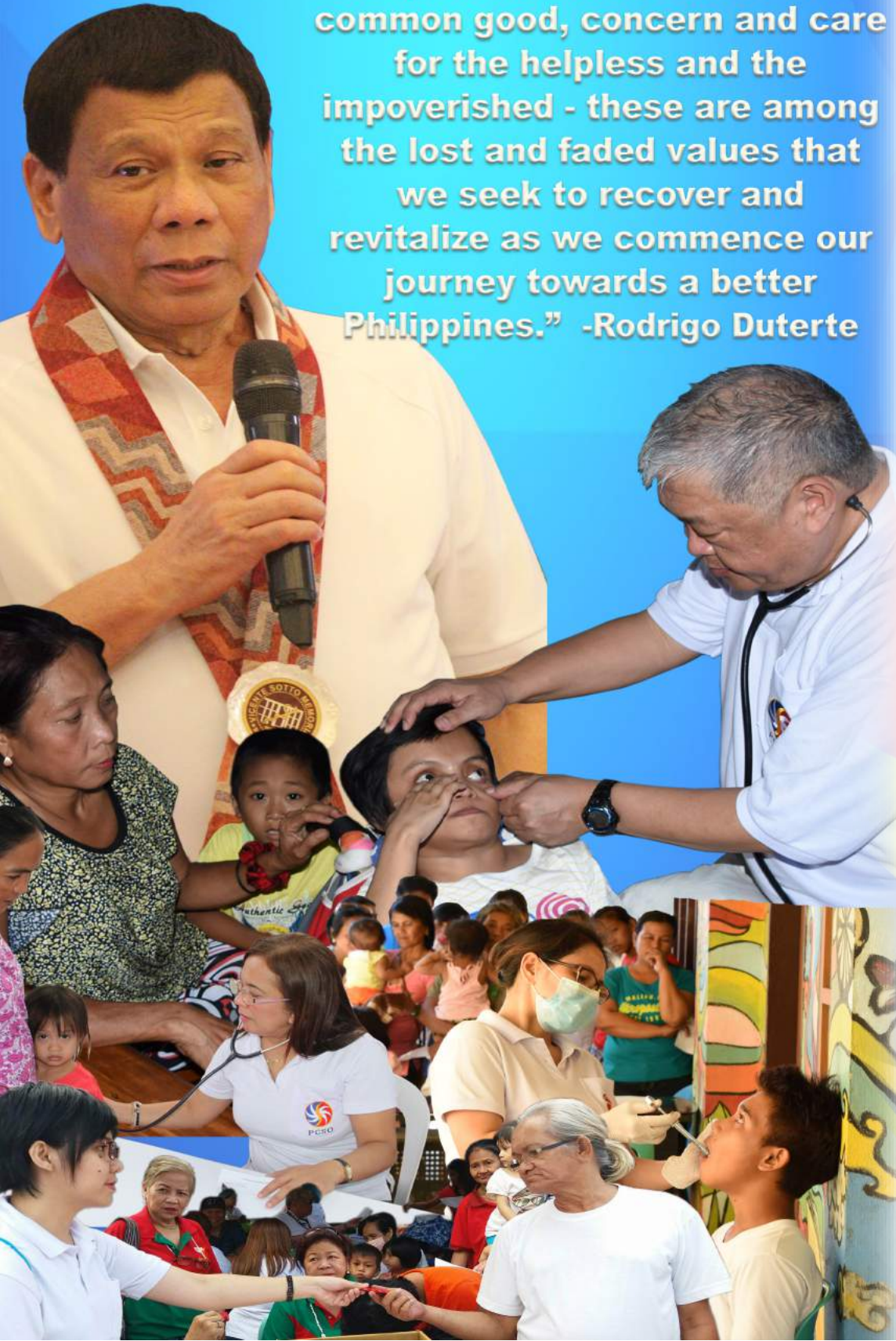

“What PCSO wants is for the illegal gambling to migrate to legal numbers game, and their generic name is STL...”, PCSO General Manager Alexander F. Balutan stated on the recent media forum of the agency.

It was another successful media forum of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office held in Summit Circle Hotel in Cebu City on Sunday, February 11, 2018. PCSO General Manager Alexander F. Balutan led the “Sama-samang Talakayan” which aims to reach the local media up close and personal. Together with the General Manager were PCSO Charity Assistance Department Manager Rubin Magno and Visayas Department Manager Federico Damole who answered the questions from Cebuano media regarding charity assistance programs of the office.

In a short presentation, PCSO Visayas Department Manager Federico Damole reported before the local media, the well implementation of the charity services and programs in the Visayas Department. He also emphasized the continuous revenue increase of the expanded Small Town Lottery (STL) since it started sometime in September of last year.

It was CAD Manager Magno who answered the questions addressing Charity Assistance of the agency. He then mentioned that the daily Individual Medical Assistance Program (IMAP) allocation of Visayas rose up to P3.2 million. He even mentioned that this increase on the daily IMAP allocation was made as a result of the increase of the Small Town Lottery revenue.

PCSO RECEIVES FOI CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) received its Freedom of Information (FOI) Certificate of Compliance from the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) for being fully compliant with the requirements set forth by the Inter-Agency Task Force on the Harmonization of National Government Performance Monitoring, Information and Reporting Systems (AO TASK FORCE 25) through its Circular No. 2017-1, section 5. In the same way, a new requirement under the 2017 guidelines for the criteria and conditions for the grant of the Performance Based Bonus (PBB) to eligible government employees.

PCSO published the Freedom of Information (FOI) Peoples Manual to the Agency's Website Transparency Seal.

The purpose of the People's Freedom of Information (FOI) Manual (Manual) is to provide the process to guide and assist the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) including its Extension and Branch Offices, in dealing with requests of information received under Executive Order (E.O.) No. 2.

On July 23, 2016, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte signed the Executive Order No. 2 series of 2016 stated that, "OPERATIONALIZING IN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH THE PEOPLE'S CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO INFORMATION AND THE STATE POLICIES TO FULL PUBLIC DISCLOSURE AND TRANSPARENCY IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES."

PCSO will remain steadfast and continuously find ways to improve public service delivery and bring PCSO closer to people.

Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) Chairman Anselmo Simeon P. Pinili expressed in all modesty on Thursday, February 15, 2018, before the Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines (ULAP) at the Waterfront Pavilion Hotel in Manila, that the agency is open for any amendments on the existing Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the expanded Small Town Lottery (STL).

“We (PCSO) are open for any amendments on the current IRR of STL for the amelioration of its operation and to ensure its constitutionality,” the chairman stated.

The thought of amending the IRR of PCSO’s STL came up after some local authorities questioned the constitutionality of the 2016 STL Revised IRR that govern its operations.

Meanwhile, Batangas Governor Hermilando Mandanas, who is also the LPP (League of Provinces of the Philippines) Council Adviser, appreciated PCSO’s effort in giving the charity services to poor communities, ***“We would like to give our gratitude to PCSO for their assistance***

to local government units and we hope that we could always be partner in delivering medical needs to our constituents.”

ULAP Sec. Gen. Atty. Edmund R. Abesamis presided the National Executive Board Special Consultative Meeting on the Draft Executive Order on STL-IRR amendments. Also

present, were Board Executive Vice-President Mayor Edgardo Pamintuan and ULAP Vice Chairman Vice-Governor Antonio Albano.

Atty. Abesamis stated that after the Special Consultative Meeting, ULAP will conduct further consultations with the different leagues to address remaining issues on the draft executive order on STL-IRR amendments and to accomplished the required Certificate of No Objection.

Madalas mabanggit ng maraming Pilipino ang salitang aneurysm matapos masawi ang aktres na si Isabel Granada dahil dito.

Ano nga ba ang aneurysm? Ang aneurysm ay pamamaga ng maninipis na arteries o ugat na dinadaluyan ng dugo mula sa ating puso. Maraming Pilipino ngayon ang natatakot sa sakit na ito partikular na ang brain aneurysm.

Si Ginang Erma Selibio, 62 anyos, may dalawang anak, sina Andrew Hugh at John. Si Gng. Erma ay dating Head ng Medical Social Services ng AFP Health Service Command bago atakihin ng brain aneurysm.

“Nakarating na ako sa heaven,” ito ang binitawang pahayag ni Gng. Selibio habang sinisimulang ikwento ang kaniyang mga pinagdaanan sa pagtama ng brain aneurysm.

“Nung ma-coma ako, nakakita ako ng maraming pinto sa mga ulap, may isang nakabukas na pinto, pumasok ako dito, at nakita ko doon ang isang lalaki na hindi ko makilala ang mukha, sinalubong ako nito at inakbayan, saka inalalayan palabas ng pinasok kong silid, paglabas ko ng pinto, nagising na ako mula sa pagkaka-comatose ng sampung araw,” umiiyak na kwento ng ginang.

Sa awa at tulong ng Panginoong Dios ay naagapan ang brain aneurysm na tumama sa ginang matapos maisagawa ang matagumpay na operasyon dito.

Milagro nga kung ituring ng kaniyang pamilya ang nangyaring pagsagip sa buhay ng kanilang ilaw ng tahanan. “It’s really a miracle from God...” pahayag ng kaniyang asawa at dalawang anak.

Sa loob ng (45) apatnapu't limang taon ay namuhay ng normal si Joselito. Nakapag-aral, bagamat hanggang highschool lamang, nakapag-asawa at nabiyayaan ng kambal na anak. Dahil sa kaniyang kondisyon ay naging adbokasiya niya ang tumulong sa mga PWD na mamuhay din ng normal at

hindi maging pabigat sa lipunan.

Gayunman, dahil sa nagkakaead na ang ginoo ay nararamdaman na nito ang hirap ng kaniyang kalagayan. Wala kasing angkop na sapatos si Joselito para sa maayos niyang paglalakad.
