PCSO's Consistent Strong Performance: Hits 20% Increase in Revenues for 2018

In 2018, amidst a challenging year for the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO), the institution embodied an unwavering commitment to the pursuit of quality, excellence and improvement in the management of gaming products and charity programs, benefiting millions of Filipinos, extending a helping hand in health-care, nationwide.



For 2018, PCSO generated a total of Php63,557,912,238.39 billion, marking a 20% increase from its total generated revenue in 2017 which was Php52,982,703,111.04. All lotto/number games, (except for Keno, which dropped at 18% from 2017's revenue of Php5,357,611,520.00 down to Php4,397,969,030.00) showed volume and profit growth. A big chunk of the amount comprise of the most patronized number games of the Filipino people, the Lotto and Digit Games with a .14% increase at P31,902,529,360.00 billion. Followed by Small Town Lottery (STL) that garnered an exceptional 66% increase at Php26,103,442,348.39 from 2017's Php15,743,604,391.44. Instant Sweepstakes got Php1,149,000,000.00 revenue while Traditional Sweepstakes generated Php4,867,500.00.

Individual Medical Assistance Program, the flagship medical assistance program which extends financial assistance for hospitalization and medical expenses of the underprivileged and sick Filipinos, regardless of class or status provided various health and medical assistance to more patients resourcing an increase of 27%, catering a total of 528,190 patients nationwide, with a corresponding total amount of Php8,682,919,581.50 billion. Through it's medical and dental mission, there were 9,231 patients catered, spending Php626,249.20 rocketing at 233% increase from released amount of Php188,006.50 catering 3,490 patients (at 164% increase) in 2017. PCSO also allocated the following amounts of Php35,475,050.00 for Institutional Partnership, and Php524,341.45 for Employees Consultation and Management Program increasing at 153% increase for the latter.

STL revenues, under its charity fund sharing scheme, were divided to cities/municipalities (17% increase at Php552,994,980.70 from 2017's Php472,422,650.12), congressional districts (26% increase at Php131,169,827.06 from 2017's

Php103,718,348.47), provinces (35% increase at Php203,208,775.20 from 2017's Php150,280,559.67), Philippine National Police, PNP (29% increase at Php406,417,550.41 from 2017's Php314,948,433.41), Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, CIDG (11% increase at Php87,446,551.37 from 2017's Php78,737,108.35. For 2018, it was noted that, National Bureau of Investigation, NBI received its share in the amount of Php11,326,268.98.

It is also the year that, together with Department of Health (DoH), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), and Philhealth, PCSO signed a joint Administrative Order on Streaming Access to Medical Assistance Funds of the Government, that aims to make it more accessible and convenient for Filipinos to avail medical assistance funds from the government through the Malasakit Center. 2018 was the year that PCSO was recognized being the 6th top paying Government Owned and Controlled Company (GOCC), contributing Php2.535 Billion to the national government, in pursuant to RA7656.

The positive trends have been seen over the years continued during 2018. Organic volume growth in lot-to game prizes were noted as it increased in 24% in prize shares from 2017's Php2,804,020,978.00 to Php3,482,506,640.00 as PCSO continues not only to gain market shares, dedicated to healing the Filipino nation but to also give hope and new life to many. 2018 was the year that made Philippine History, when two (2) lucky winners from Luzon and Visayas won and shared the Ultra Lotto 6/58 jackpot prize of Php1.18Billion. The event also became the talk of the town and became "trending" in Social Media platforms, from September, mostly during first few weeks, month of October.

"Based on PCSO's strong core value propositions in serving the Filipino people through medical care and reduced healthcare costs especially to our underprivileged countrymen, the institution continues to remain prudently optimistic about the future and will be stronger for the benefit of its stakeholders, employees, beneficiaries and supporters." PCSO General Manager Alexander F. Balutan noted. "As we celebrate PCSO's 85th anniversary this 2019, The Filipino People is the main driver for this continued positive underlying commitment to deliver efficient and timely charitable services." GM Balutan concluded.

CA Sustains PCSO Claims

Contradictory to the allegation and assertion of Globaltech Mobile Online Corporation, the Court of Appeals' (CA) decision dated January 14, 2019 dismissed both the filed petitions of PCSO and Globaltech and **directed both parties to submit to arbitration.**

Within the resolved decision, it is a fallacious statement that the other party is claiming, stating that the CA is halting PCSO from going after illegal activities of Globaltech. Globaltech, in the complete loss and absence of hope, is still convincing the public to patronize illegal games/operations by trying to interpret the decision of the Court making it appear favourable to them.

The government is losing millions of revenues due to the illegal games of Globaltech, that could have been transparently put into good use and to the additional budget allotted for medical and health assistance for the Filipino people, especially our less fortunate countrymen. Since Q1 2016, after PCSO terminated its Deed of Authority, the mobile online company already stopped remitting revenues to PCSO, depriving the government and the indigent Filipinos seeking medical assistance from PCSO.

PCSO under its charter (RA 1169), is granted exclusive authority to operate sweepstakes, lotteries and other similar activities for the purpose of raising funds for health, medical assistance and charities of national character.

It can be recalled that PCSO granted a Deed of Authority to Globaltech to operate Peryahan ng Bayan on a TEST RUN basis in Quezon City, Pangasinan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Palawan, Rizal, Catanduanes, Negros Occidental, Cebu, Bohol, Agusan del Norte, Davao del Sur, Misamis Oriental, South Cotabato and Zamboanga del Sur. Within the given window to operate, Globaltech has been violating the processes of its operations.



The Deed of Authority was only until March 31, 2016 which was never extended by PCSO. Thus, the contract has already expired more than a month after alleged status quo order. It is also noted that Globaltech applied before the Regional Trial Court of Pasig, Branch 161 a provisional remedy of a writ of preliminary injunction.

Despite the expiration of the Deed of Authority, however, Globaltech continued with its operation without the knowledge, supervision and control of PCSO without remitting any single centavo to PCSO, up to this date and has a total unremitted sales of **Php39, 506,890.02** (excluding penalty charges) or a total of **Php 506,193,974.26** (including penalty charges), as of January 23, 2019 reported by the Branch Operations Sector.

At this instance, we call on the Bureau of Internal Revenue to scrutinize the books of Globaltech if they are declaring the true income from its gaming activities and if Globaltech is remitting the taxes due to the government. We also, at the same time reminding the public that those who passively accepts the work of evil is as much involved in it as those who get involve into perpetuating the act. Those who accept wrongdoings without protesting, condoning against it is considered cooperating with it.

PCSO Hits back on Peryahan ng Bayan Heckler

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office derives its income from its gaming products such as sweepstakes, lottery games, small town lottery (stl) and other legal numbers game which were not mention. The main thrust is to inculcate enough funds for individual and institutional charity programs regardless of economic class.

PCSO's Legal Department categorically states that the Dec. 3 2018 did not stop the expiration of Globaltech's Authority, those are just mere presumptions in attempts to flame out an already put out fire on the following basis:

1. PCSO has stopped conducting draws for Peryahan ng Bayan since the official termination by PCSO of Globaltech Mobile Online Corporation's Deed of Authority to conduct the game on Feb. 22, 2016. This Deed of Authority emanates from Republic Act No.1169 (PCSO's

Charter), which grants the exclusive authority upon PCSO to hold and conduct sweepstakes, lotteries and similar activities in the country. Since termination of Globaltech's Deed of Authority, PCSO has not authorized any entity to operate Peryahan ng Bayan.

2. The Deed of Authority granted to Globaltech was only until March 31, 2016. The Court has no authority to extend the contract of PCSO and Globaltech without the consent of both parties.
3. The alleged grant of a status quo ante order, which was allegedly provided in the 17th of March 2016 Order of the Regional Trial Court of Pasig, Branch 161 was in connection to the termination of Globaltech's Deed of Authority on 22nd February 2016. It did not stop the expiration of Globaltech's Deed of Authority on March 31, 2016.
4. Globaltech applied before the Regional Trial Court of Pasig, Branch 161 a provisional remedy of a writ of preliminary injunction to stop the termination

by PCSO of its Deed of Authority over Peryahan ng Bayan. Globaltech's application for writ of preliminary injunction was denied in the 13th of October 2017 Order of the said court.

5. There is no writ or preliminary injunction issued by the Regional Trial Court of Pasig City, Branch 161 or any other court to stop PCSO from implementing the termination of Globaltech's Deed of Authority. There is no order from any court decreeing the continued operations by Globaltech of Peryahan ng Bayan.
6. With the continued operations of Peryahan ng Bayan by Globaltech, PCSO has not received any sales remittances, which should form part of government funds, and therefore, said Peryahan ng Bayan operations is illegal and is prohibited.

The above enlisted sightings should be enough to disclose any claims by Globaltech. As an advocate of responsible gaming and charitable works to individuals and institutional partners, the agency is bent on keeping its contracts and dealings with utmost distinction to maintain our dignity to the betting public.



PCSO honors Congress invitation on House Bill No. 3028



Officials from the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) appeared before the House Committee on Social Service Technical Working Group Chaired by Rep. Carlos Isagani Zarate to discuss House Bill No. 3028, entitled: “An act Granting Fifty Percent (50%) Discounts from Funeral Services to Indigent Families and Granting Free Funeral Services to Extremely Poor Families Nationwide, Appropriating Funds Therefor and for Other Purposes,” on January 30, 2019 at House of Representatives, Batasan Pambansa Complex, Quezon City.

Ted Quiano, Chief of Staff, Office of the Chairman, Atty Marissa Medrano, Legislative Liaison Officer and Muriel Pajarillo, OIC-Manager Charity Assistant Department presented the position of PCSO on the proposed bill. PCSO acknowledged the purpose of the said bill and was looking forward to its enactment.

The TWG meeting was also attended by other government agencies and some Partylist representatives where each sector was given a chance to present and clarify its position. Healing the Nation Together: PCSO Fortifies Ties with Malasakit Center

According to a Social Weather Station (SWS) report for the fourth (4th) quarter of 2017, there are about ten (10) million Filipino citizens who considered themselves as poor. The social weather report body also noted that an average Filipino family has five members, and a household must earn at least Php15,000.00.00 a month so as not to be considered destitute. This excludes medical and health needs.

In year 2018 month of September, the first ever *Malasakit Center* in Metro Manila was launched to public in Philippine General Hospital, with high hopes to reach more Filipinos as many still don't have access to free quality healthcare in Metro Manila. To solidify this great endeavor for our countrymen, Special Assistant to the President (SAP) Christopher Lawrence 'Bong' Go led the opening of the 19th "*Malasakit Center*" across the Philippines and 6th in Luzon on 7th of January 2019, at the Lung Center of the Philippines together with Philippine

Gaming and Amusement Corporation (PAGCOR) Chairperson/CEO Andrea Domingo and Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office's (PCSO) Chairperson Anselmo Simeon Pinili and PCSO General Manager, Alexander F. Balutan. Present also to support was Department of Health (DoH) Secretary Dr. Francisco Tiongson Duque III (not in photo).

To date, There are currently 19 *Malasakit Centers* nationwide, 6 in Luzon, including the recently opened in Lung Center since the inception of the project and will continue to expand. The *Malasakit Center* project was initiated by Duterte's administration as "a one stop to go shop," expediting medical services also aims for patients to not spend too much time, money and effort, going to different agencies. The project extends helping hand to all Filipinos, especially the qualified less fortunate individuals.

Ending Violence in Women is Paramount and Possible: PCSO vows to be a part ending VAW

Based on a 2018 data report from United Nations, to date, Philippines is a part of the 139 developing countries (Low and Middle Income Country, LMIC) across the world. Encapsulated with the idea of development, one remarkable and noticeable improvement in the society would be the diversity and inclusivity of gender equality among men, LGBT community and in women. These efforts can be tagged as one of the innovative foundations in sustainability of human development.

Violence against women (VAW) is probably one of the most pressing issues globally, and appears as one of the country's pervasive social problems. Ten years ago, according to the 2008 National Demographic and Health Survey conducted by the National Statistics Office, one in every five Filipino women age 15-49 has experienced physical violence since age 15. An alarming challenge that despite efforts to address the concern, until present day, VAW exists.

To be a part of the advocacy in Gender and Development (GAD) specifically in violence against women, Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) conducted a two (2) day sectoral training seminar for employees to have a deeper understanding in gender and development last 19th and 20th of December 2018 at The Lake Hotel, Tagaytay City for the Executive Offices of the agency, facilitated by Atty. Maryknoll Capili-H. Ibrahim, an independent GAD learning provider, Civil Service Institute (CSI).



The seminar highlighted the Magna Carta of Women (RA 9710)/Violence Against Women & their Children (R.A 9262) and why PCSO supports learning activities on Gender Mainstreaming and GAD activities.

Among the beneficial and informative takeaways, Ms. Capili-H. Ibrahim tackled the basic but crucial definition of discrimination in women. That it is any-gender based distinction, exclusion or restriction which has the effect or purpose of impairing or nullifying the recognition, enjoyment or exercise by women, irrespective of their marital status, on a basis of equality of men and women, of human rights and fundamental freedoms.

She also noted RA 9262 (Anti-VAWC), which expanded the range of actionable violence- physical, sexual, psychological and economical violence. The seminar also discussed the rights of the women who are in military and how to be more aware of the characteristic of a battered woman, which are the following: the woman believes that the violence was her fault, that she has an ability to place the responsibility for the violence elsewhere and she has irrational belief that the abuser is omnipresent and omniscient.

"As human beings, it is our responsibility to be aware of our surroundings and what we can do better as a citizen" Capili-H. Ibrahim quoted.

The two day sectoral training – seminar was filled with engaging activities participated by PCSO employees from the executive offices relative to the topic.

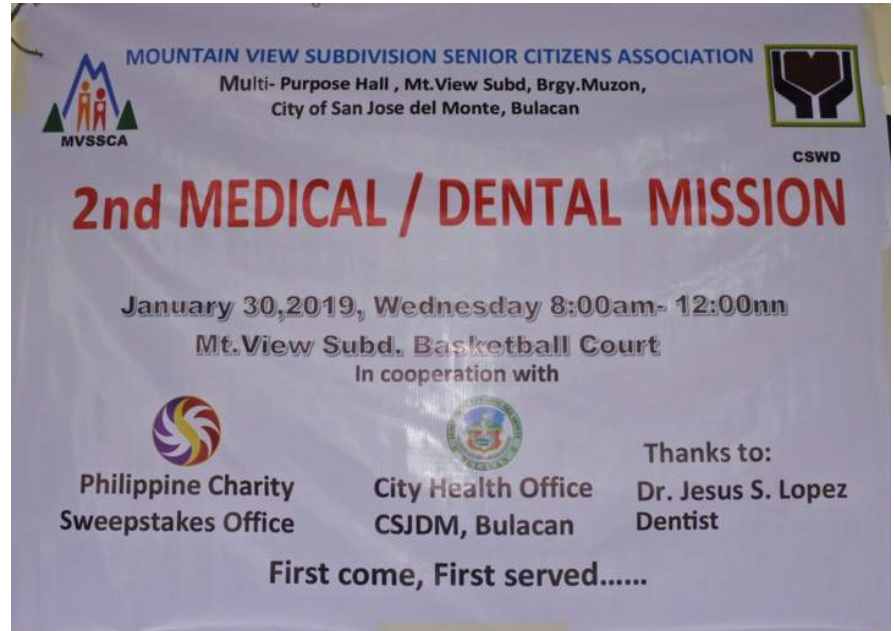
PCSO SERVES THE RESIDENTS OF BRGY. MUZON, SAN JOSE DELMONTE, BULACAN

1.Reception: Nurses play a vital role during the medical mission. They gathered the basic information of the patients (names, age, family history, and complaints) and taking the vital signs of the patients prior to consultation.



The medical and dental mission organized by the Pasig Catholic College Alumni Association Inc. Hs Batch 1987 in partnership with the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office LSGH is an apostolic endeavor that takes place once a year. The mission gives free health services to less fortunate members of their partner communities on January 22, 2019 ,held at the PCC grounds.

Led by the PCSO Medical Services Department, the free medical mission is one of the many charitable programs of PCSO geared in providing aid and improving the health and lives of underprivileged people in the city who have limited or no access to the most basic medical health and necessities of life, especially in the far-flung barangays. It is also one of the PCSO's contributions to President Rodrigo Duterte Universal Health Care Coverage for Filipinos. The mission provided services to 89 medical patients and 4 dental patients.

The Medical and Dental Mission as expected, a crowd of people eagerly waited at the mission site. Tents were installed inside the PCC premises. After a quick breakfast, all helpers resumed work in organizing the pharmacy, the medical, and the dental area. A few minutes before 8:00 am, the team leader Dr. Ma. Isabel A. Vinteres signaled the start of the mission

Young and old patiently waited for their turn, either to find relief for an illness or for dental extraction.

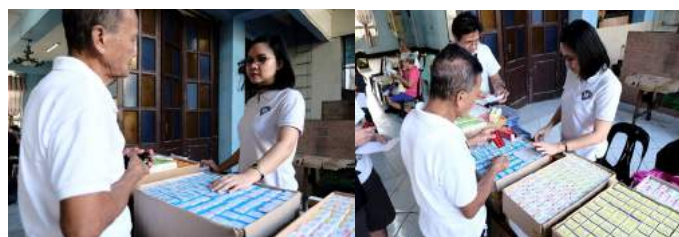
2. Medical Checkup: During the medical mission, the doctor helped to treat illnesses and injuries. Often a doctor prescribed medicines to patients to make him well.



3. Dental checkup/ tooth extraction: Dentists diagnosed and treated problems with patients' teeth, gums, and related parts of the mouth. They provide advice and instruction on taking care of the teeth and gums and on diet choices that affect oral health. The Dentist may recommend tooth extraction depends upon on their assessment.



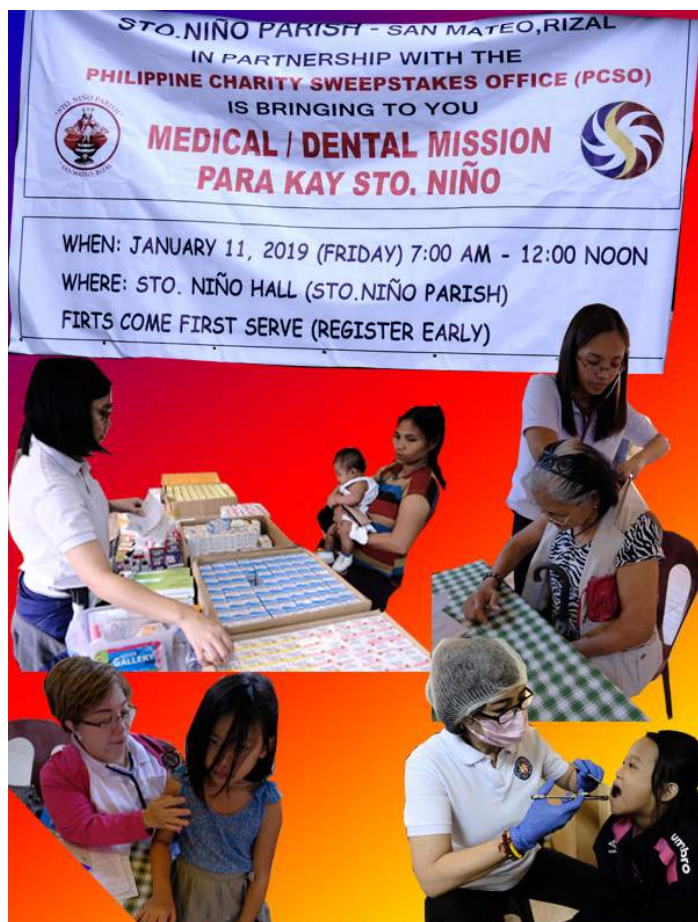
4. Free Medicines: Pharmacist dispensed medicine to a named person on the basis of a prescription. She also instructed patients on how to take the medicines based on the dosage given by the attending physician.

A total of 337 patients were served from 8:00 am to 12:00 noon.

The Medical Mission program of PCSO provides outreach health care activities in the depressed community within and outside of Metro Manila and nearby provinces including provision of free medicines for those who have less or no access to health services offered by the Local government.

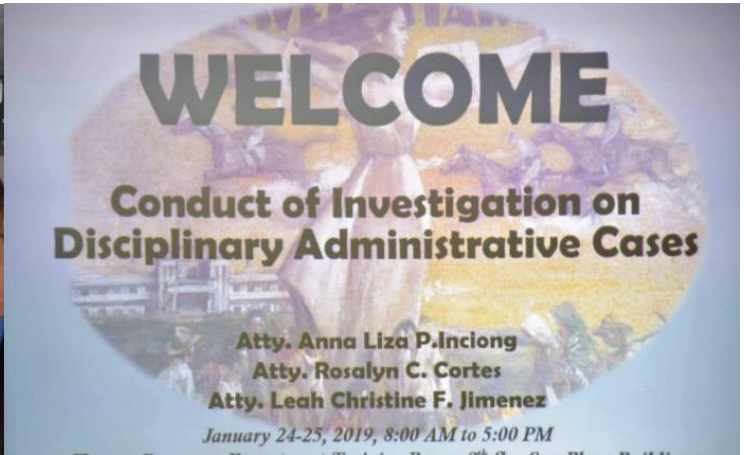
