

PHILIPPINE CHARITY SWEEPSTAKES OFFICE YEAR-END REPORT CY 2019



The **Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO)** is the principal government agency for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance and services, and charities of national character thru the holding and conduct of lotteries and similar activities, in such frequency and manner, as shall be determined, and subject to such rules and regulations as shall be promulgated by the Board of Directors (*Section 1, RA 1169, as amended by Batas Pambansa Bilang 42 and Presidential Decree No. 1157*).

FUND GENERATION

PCSO generates funds through its PCSO games such as the Lotto including Digit Games, Keno, Instant Sweepstakes, Traditional Sweepstakes, and Peryahan Games.

Retail Receipts

For CY 2019, PCSO generated a total of **P44,028,405,618.70** from its Lotto, Keno, Small Town Lottery (STL), Peryahan Games, Instant Sweepstakes, and Traditional Sweepstakes.

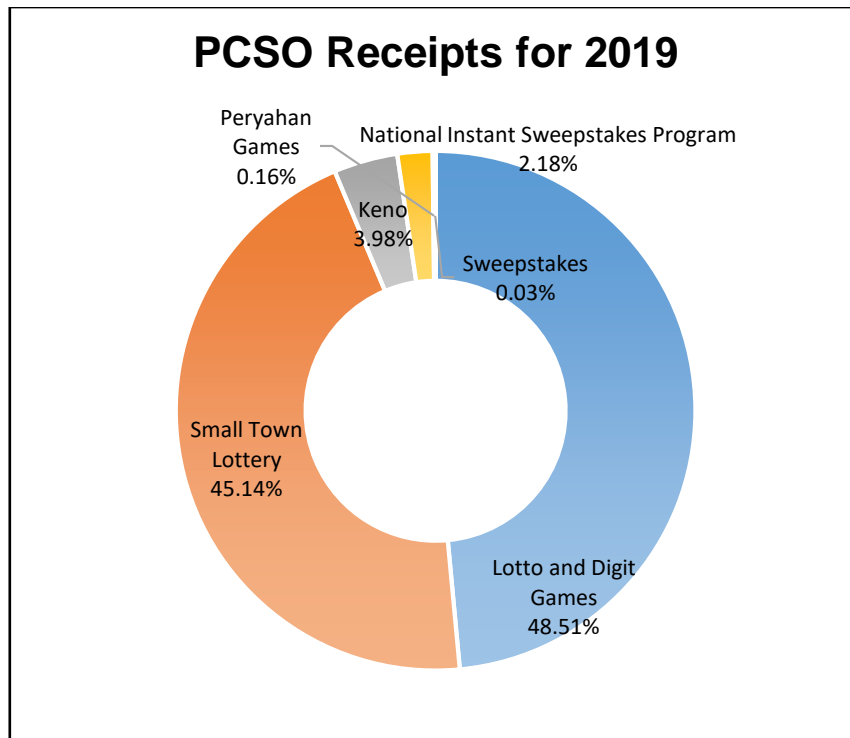
All PCSO Games

Lotto including the Digit Games gained the highest retail receipts amounting to **P21,358,729,500.00**. Meanwhile, the Small Town Lottery yielded a total of **P19,875,355,746.99** in 2019. Keno also posted **P1,753,286,419.41**. The National Instant Sweepstakes gained a total of **P961,013,773.30**. For 2019, Peryahan Games generated **P68,770,179.00**. Lastly, the Traditional Sweepstakes contributed a total of **P11,250,000.00** from January 1 to December 31, 2019.

Among all PCSO games offered for the gaming public, Lotto and Digit Games remain to be the biggest earner, contributing 48.51% of the total sales in 2019. Meanwhile, the Small Town Lottery games which are the STL Pares, STL Swer3, and STL Swer2, remain to be the second highest earner with 45.14% of sales from all PCSO games. This is followed by Keno with 3.98%, Instant Sweepstakes with 2.18%, Peryahan Games with 0.16%, and Sweepstakes with 0.03%.

Lotto

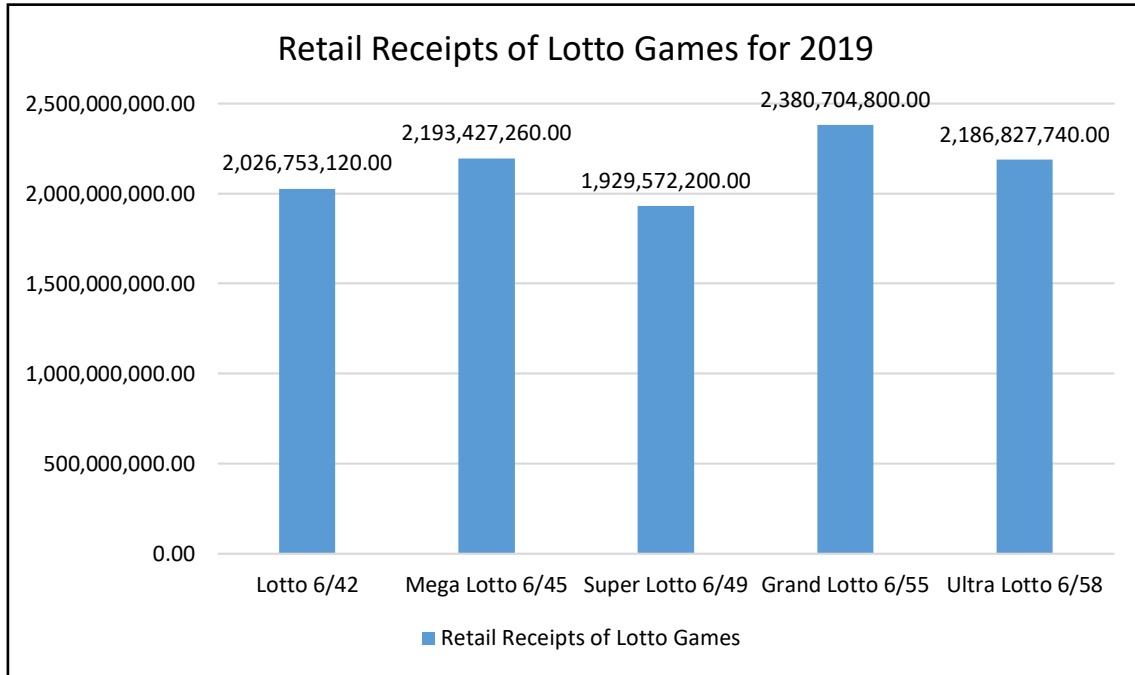
PCSO offers various Lotto games such as Lotto 6/42, Mega Lotto 6/45, Super Lotto 6/49, Grand Lotto 6/55, and Ultra Lotto 6/58.

For CY 2019, Grand Lotto 6/55 is the biggest earner among all lotto games which yielded almost P2.3 Billion Pesos, followed by Mega Lotto 6/45 with P2.19 Billion Pesos. Ultra Lotto 6/58 came in third with P2.19 Billion Pesos. Meanwhile, Lotto 6/42 and Super Lotto 6/49 contributed P2.03 Billion Pesos and P1.93 Billion Pesos respectively.

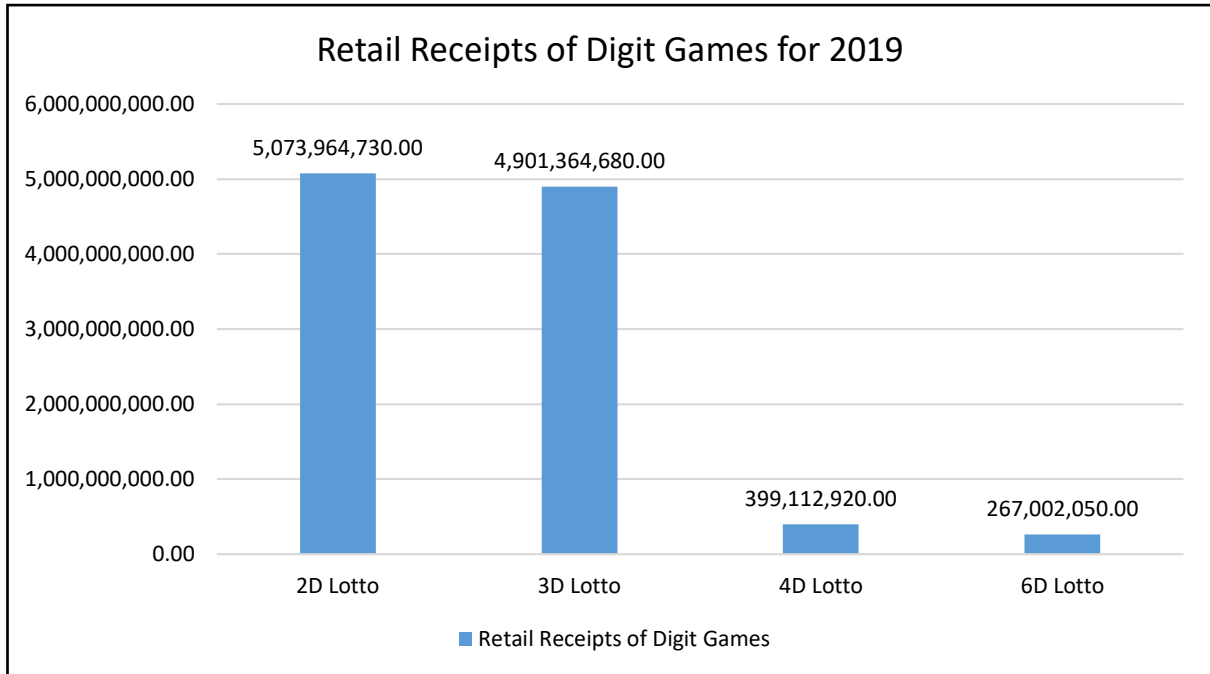
Digit Games

PCSO also offers various Digit Games such as the 2D Lotto, 3D Lotto, 4D Lotto, and 6D Lotto, which were previously named as EZ2 Lotto, Swertres Lotto, 4 Digit, and 6 Digit respectively.

From January 1 to December 31, 2019, the Digit games contributed P10.64 Billion Pesos to the total retail receipts of PCSO. Among all Digit Games, the 2D Lotto game is the biggest earner, contributing P5.07 Billion Pesos, followed by 3D Lotto with P4.9 Billion Pesos.

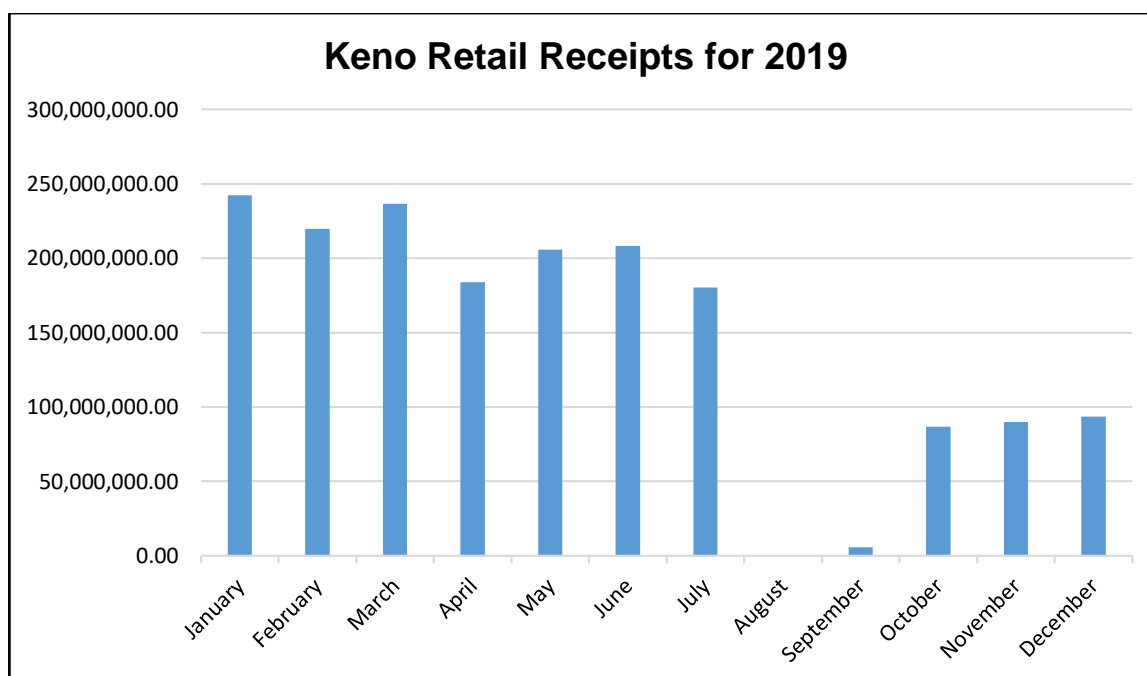

**There are no retail receipts for the month of August since President Rodrigo R. Duterte suspended all PCSO games on July 26, 2019. Keno resumed on September 28, 2019.*



Based on the graph above, the months of January, March, and February gained the top three highest retail receipts of Keno for 2019. Meanwhile, the month of September has the lowest retail receipts for the year. This might be caused by the suspension of all PCSO games during the month of August.

National Instant Sweepstakes Program (NISP)

The National Instant Sweepstakes Program of Instant Sweepstakes is one of the regular games of which is implemented nationwide through Authorized Distributors (ADs). For 2019, PCSO generated **P961,013,773.30** from Instant Sweepstakes.

Peryahan Games

In line with the decision of the Court of Appeals and the Arbitration Proceedings reached by PCSO and Globaltech which is the system provider of the games, the Peryahan Games which are Hulog Holen, Throw Coins, and Gulong ng Swertres, resumed its operations on October 29, 2019. PCSO authorized the resumption of the Peryahan Games in the following areas with no STL operations, as follows:

- Cebu City
- NCR – Quezon City or Central District
- Province of Rizal
- Province of Pangasinan
- Province of Oriental Mindoro
- Province of Bohol
- Province of Palawan
- Puerto Princesa
- Zamboanga City
- Province of Zamboanga del Sur

For CY 2019, PCSO released a total of **P6.65 Billion Pesos** for its various charity programs which benefitted **1,395,774 beneficiaries**.

Among all charity programs of the PCSO Charity Assistance Department, the Individual Medical Assistance Program (IMAP) or IMAP has the biggest released amount of assistance with **P5.96 Billion Pesos**, followed by the Calamity Assistance Program with **P158,065,000.00**. Ranking third and fourth are the Integrated Health for Overall Productivity and Empowerment (I-HOPE) with P110.35 Million Pesos and Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program with **P105,660,000.00**, respectively. Next is the AFP/PNP Health Facilities/Capability-building Project with **P203,946,975.00**. Meanwhile, PCSO gave **P65.28 Million Pesos** for the Procurement

of Medical Equipment. Under the Endowment Fund Program, PCSO granted **P33 Million Pesos**, while **P7.43 Million Pesos** was allocated for its Institutional Partnership Program. Lastly, PCSO released **P468,480.00** under its Milk Feeding Program.

On the other hand, among all PCSO charity programs under its Medical Services Department, the PCSO Medicine Donation Program has the biggest share in terms of amount of assistance with **P5.2 Million Pesos** worth of medicines, followed by the Out-patient Services with assistance of more than **P3 Million Pesos**. Next is PCSO's Medical and Dental Mission in which the agency released **P1,145,223.28**. Lastly, PCSO allocated **P649,924.57** for its Employees Consultation and Management Services

Individual Medical Assistance Program (IMAP)

The Individual Medical Assistance Program (IMAP) is PCSO's flagship medical assistance program which extends financial assistance for medical and hospitalization expenses of needy and sick Filipinos, regardless of class or status, through the issuance of guarantee letters (GLs) to partner public and private hospitals.

For CY 2019, PCSO provided a total of **P5,959,771,103.92** for **517,696** patients in need of various medical and health services nationwide.

In terms of the nature of request, confinement is the top requested assistance with 208,815 patients served for CY 2019, followed by request for medicines such as chemodrugs, epo injection, and specialized medicines with 200,753 patients. Laboratory/Diagnostic and Procedure Treatment such as laboratory/radiation/laser, eyes operation/ radiosurgery (Gamma Knife), comes in third with 55,399 patients served, while 31,398 patients requested for hemodialysis treatment. PCSO also received requests for medical appliances such as implant, stent, device, pacemaker, coclear, balloon catheter, and valve for 11,367 patients. Further, 7,230 patients

requested occupational, speech, physical, and behavioral rehabilitative therapy. Lastly, PCSO granted assistance for assistive devices such as hearing aid, wheelchair, prosthesis, crutches, braces, and ventilator rentals for 2,725 patients.

“At Source Ang Processing” (ASAP) Desks

For more efficient delivery of financial assistance and to make services more accessible to Filipinos, PCSO introduced the “At Source Ang Processing” (ASAP) Desk as a delivery system of IMAP.

The PCSO ASAP Desk is a point of access to the services of the IMAP established through a partnership between PCSO and hospitals that directly provide various medical and other health-related services to clients. It was established to address the long queues at PCSO Offices, long lead time for interview and timeliness of assistance. Under the ASAP, the need for personal appearance at PCSO Offices is no longer necessary. The Medical Social Services of the partner hospital assumes the responsibility to conduct patient interview and establish eligibility before transmitting the same for recommendation and approval of PCSO.

As of December 31, 2019, PCSO already has 44 ASAP Desks in various government hospitals nationwide. The table below shows the list of PCSO partner hospitals with PCSO ASAP Desks:

Calamity Assistance Program

The Calamity Assistance Program aims to assist families affected by natural and manmade calamities through the provision of funds and/or medicines, food packs and kits depending upon the needs of the beneficiaries.

For CY 2019, PCSO granted a total of **P158,065,000.00** for **815,654** beneficiaries who were affected by calamities such as typhoons, earthquakes, and fire. The table below shows the monthly breakdown of PCSO's calamity assistance:

Further, in terms of the type of calamity, the most requested assistance is calamity assistance for typhoons with 733,198 Filipinos assisted, followed by requests of 67,146 earthquake victims. PCSO also helped 17,310 Filipinos who were affected by fire incidents. Lastly, PCSO released P10 Million Pesos to the Philippine Red Cross to help the organization in its disaster and relief operations during calamities. Milk Feeding Program

This is a supplementary feeding program aimed to benefit nutritionally vulnerable group of children aged 2-6 years old. Under a tripartite agreement among the PCSO, the National Dairy Authority (NDA) and the Local Government Unit (LGU), the agency provides the necessary funds while the NDA conducts the procurement of the qualified supplier and implements the program. The LGU is tasked to organize the beneficiaries and to provide support to the NDA in mobilization, implementation and monitoring.

For CY 2019, PCSO provided **P468,480.00** for the children from the **Municipality of Oslob, Cebu**.

Medicine Donation Program

This Medicine Donation Program provides augmentation in the form of medicines to qualified government and non-governmental organizations for them to render effective health care services.

From January 1 to December 31, 2019, PCSO released **P5,197,218.27** worth of medicines to **169** government and non-government organizations.

Out-Patient Services

This program is a direct provision of medical and dental services to the general public, including the necessary medicines being prescribed by in-house doctors and dentists, and dispensed by Pharmacy staff located at the Lung Center of the Philippines (LCP) Extension Office in Quezon City.

For CY 2019, PCSO assisted **16,927** patients in which the agency allocated **P3,081,917.35**.

Medical and Dental Mission Program

PCSO's Medical and Dental Mission Program provides free medical/dental consultation and procedures including medicines, in partnership with the Local Government Units, non-government agencies, civic groups, religious organizations and other government agencies. In addition to logistic support, requesting agencies are required to provide their own doctors, dentists and nurses to complement PCSO's medical and dental team.

In 2019, a total of **12,748** patients benefitted from the program, where they received **P1,145,223.28** worth of medical/dental consultation and procedures including medicines.

Employees Consultation and Management Services

The PCSO Medical Services Department also attends to PCSO officials, employees, and their dependents, and retirees through the Employees' Clinic both at the LCP Extension Office and Head Office, Conservatory Building.

For CY 2019, PCSO granted **P649,924.57** for **30,485 requests** from PCSO officials, employees and their dependents, and retirees.

STL Shares

For CY 2019, PCSO provided P91,439,956.27 as STL Shares for cities and municipalities, while the Provincial government received a total of **P75,338,725.78** as STL shares. The table below shows the breakdown of STL shares per area:
