## I. Introduction

This report covers the operational and administrative accomplishments of PCSO including its contributions to nation-building, highlights and results of the customer feedback mechanisms of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) for the period July 1 to September 30, 2023. When applicable, for-the-period information is compared to PCSO's performance for the same period in 2022.

This document is prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Agency's reporting accountabilities to the Office of the President and the Governance Commission for Government-Owned or -Controlled Corporations (GOCCs).

## II. About PCSO

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is a 100% Government-Owned and Controlled Corporation (GOCC) under the Office of the President.

In March 1935, then President Manuel L. Quezon approved Act 4130 – the law passed by the Philippine Legislature on October 30, 1934 creating the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office, replacing the then National Charity Sweepstakes. On June 18, 1954, Republic Act 1169 (PCSO Charter), was enacted into law providing for charity sweepstakes and lotteries once a month when there are no Sweepstakes draws and races. The PCSO has since then remained to be an indispensable charity arm of the government, frequently summoned to provide funding for essential health and welfare activities and projects nationwide.

The mandate of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is to conduct lottery games to raise revenues in order to provide funds for health, medical, and welfare related activities and charities of national character.

### Vision

By 2028, the PCSO shall be an excellent government agency generating sustainable funds for charitable programs through responsible gaming.

### Mission

- We hold and conduct transparent sweepstakes races, lotteries, and other similar activities;
- We provide responsive assistance to eligible recipients and beneficiaries;
- We continuously develop our people, innovate, and improve our products and services; and
- We establish strong partnerships with responsible agents and stakeholders.

## Revenue Allocation

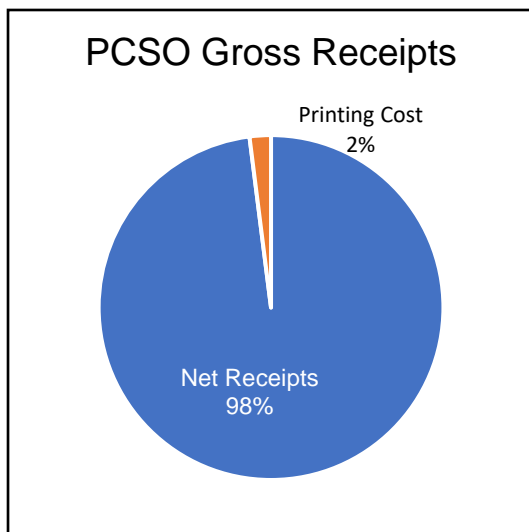


Figure 1 PCSO Gross Receipts

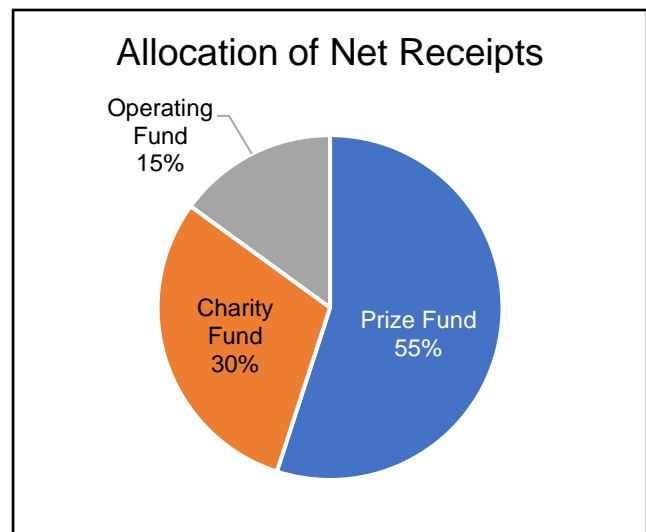


Figure 2 Allocation of Net Receipts

Section 6 of Republic Act No. 1169, otherwise known as the PCSO Charter, provides that the net receipts (gross receipts less 2% printing cost), as shown in *Figure 1*, is divided among three distinct funds: the Prize Fund at 55%, the Charity Fund at 30%, and lastly, the Operating Fund at 15% of the net receipts (*Figure 2*).

The **Prize Fund**, which accounts for 55% of the net receipts, is used to pay prizes to holders and sellers of winning tickets. Unclaimed prizes or balances in the Prize Fund revert to and become part of the Charity Fund after one (1) year.

The **Charity Fund**, which is 30% of the net receipts, is used exclusively to finance and support health programs, medical assistance, and services, and/or charities of national character.

The **Operating Fund** consists of 15% of net receipts and is used to support the PCSO's day-to-day operating/maintenance and capital expenditures. Unutilized Operating Fund at the end of the fiscal year becomes part of the Charity Fund.

### III. Operational Accomplishments

#### A. Fund Generation Activities

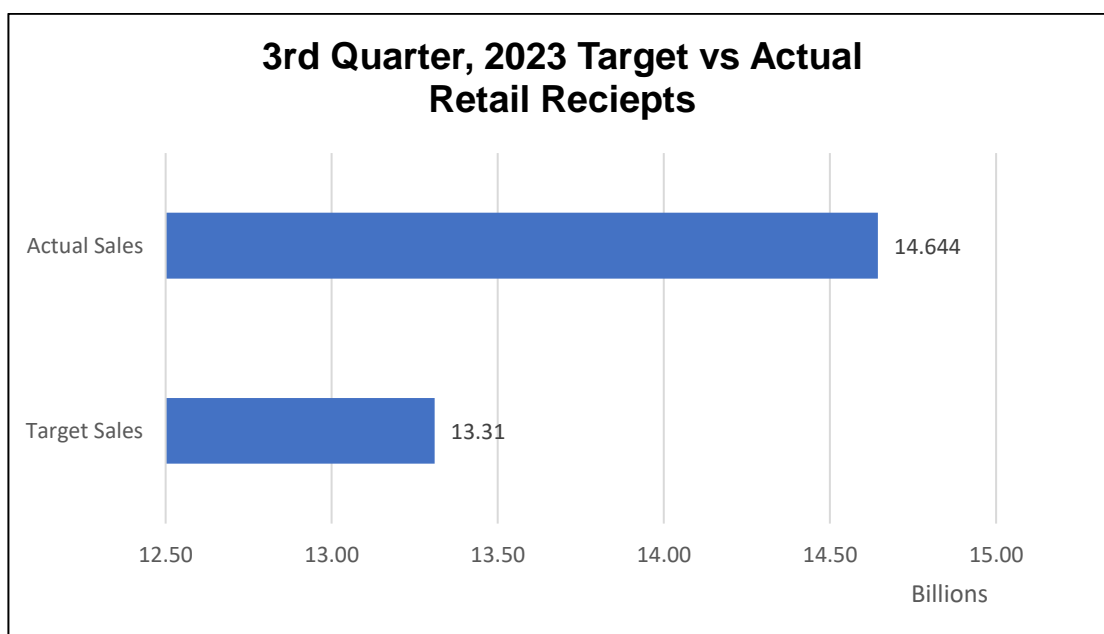


Figure 3 Target vs Actual Retail Receipts, 3rd Quarter, 2023

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) continues to surpass its target as it achieved a total gross revenue of P14,644,176,934.00 from July to September 2023. This is 10% higher than the Agency’s quarterly sales target of P13.31 Billion (Figure 3).

Looking at the revenue generated since the first semester of 2023, the PCSO has generated a total of P44,952,669,836.64 from PCSO games from January to September 2023, already attaining 89% of the target for CY 2023.

PCSO's total retail receipts earned from games for the third quarter of 2023 vis-à-vis the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2022 retail receipts resulted to a 5% decrease compared to the second quarter of the previous year. This may be attributed to the loss of sales from the National Instant Sweepstakes Program since its contract with PCSO already expired (Table 1).

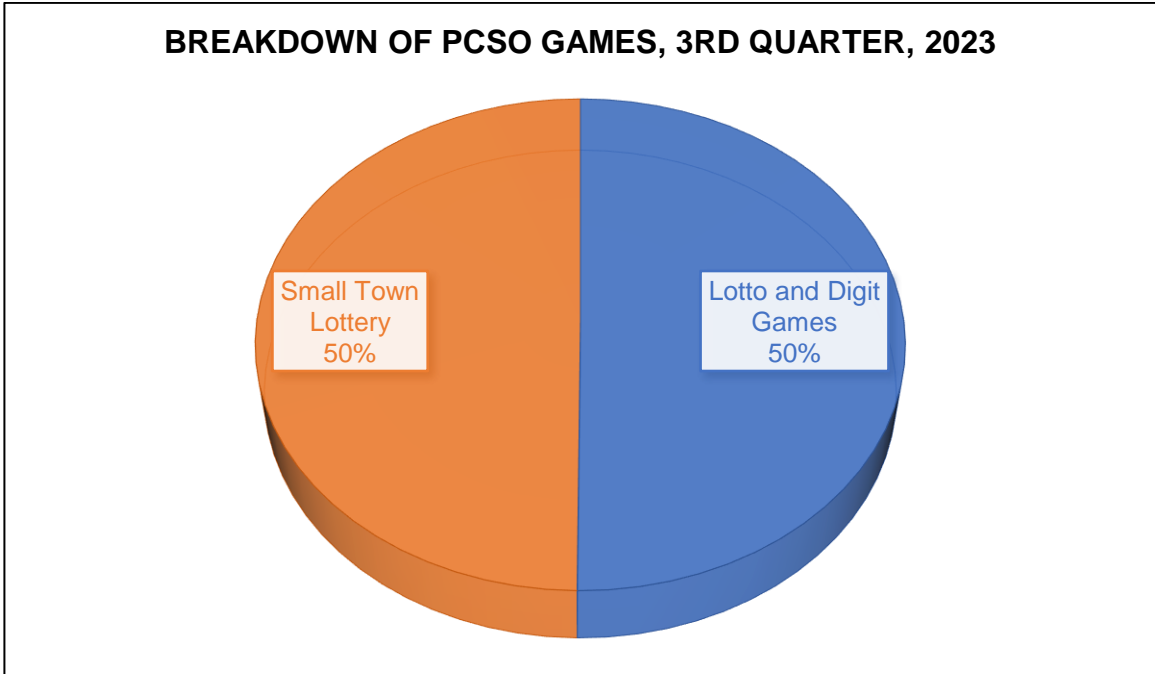


Figure 4 Breakdown of PCSO Games, 3rd Quarter, 2023

Based on Figure 4, the Lotto including Digit Games and the STL equally contributed to the revenues raised for this quarter.

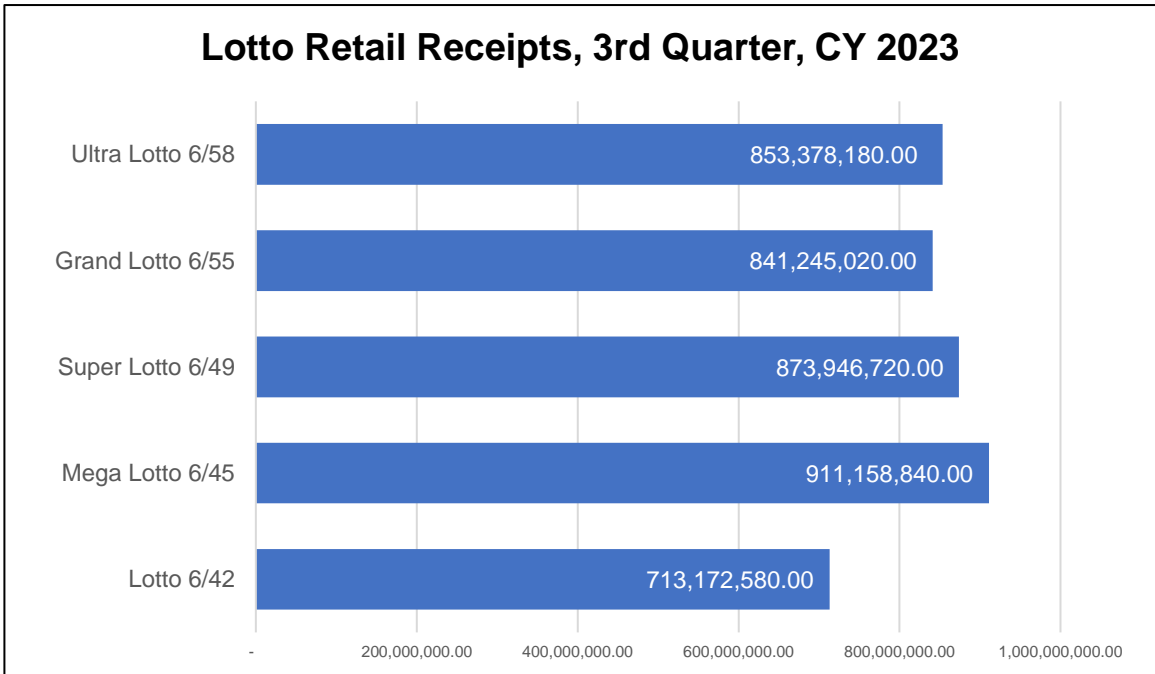


Figure 5 Lotto Sales per Game, 3rd Quarter, 2023

The lotto games contributed P4,192,901,340.00 to the total third quarter sales. Among the games, the Mega Lotto 6/45 generated the highest revenue of P911.16 million as shown in Figure 5.

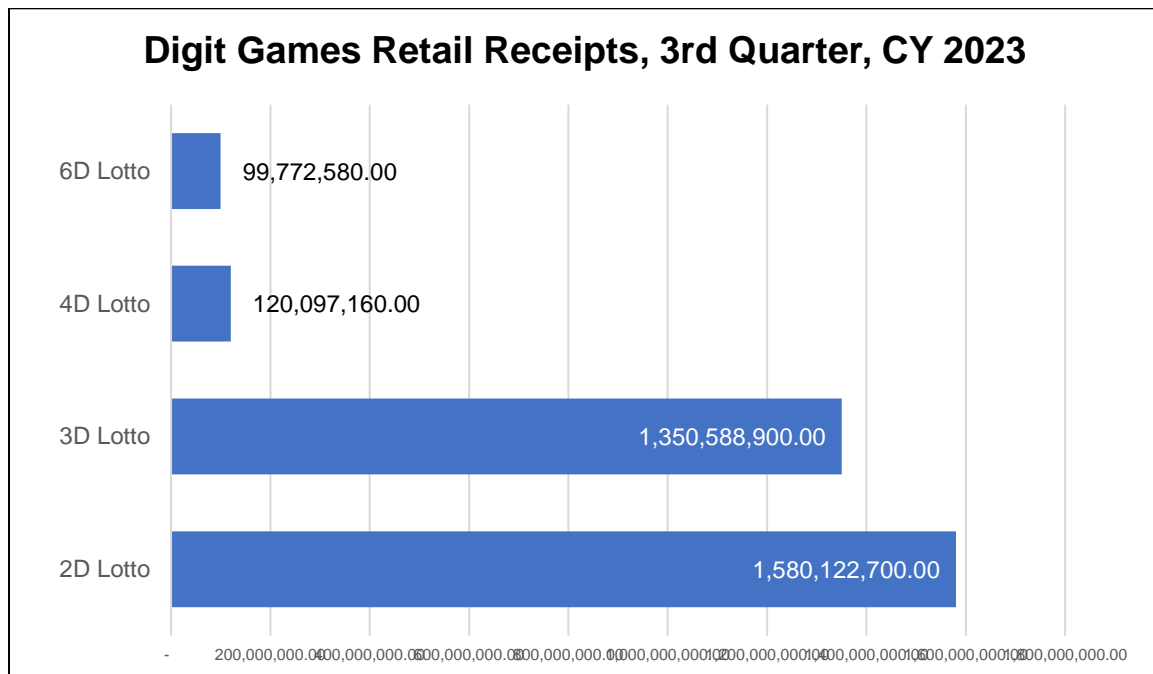


Figure 6 Digit Games Retail Receipts, 3rd Quarter, 2023

Meanwhile, the digit games posted a total of P3,150,581,340.00 from July to September 2023. Of the digit games, the highest contributor is the 2D Lotto with P1.58 Billion (Figure 6).

The Small Town Lottery (STL) generated P7,300,694,254.00 which is 3% lower than the P7.52 Billion retail receipts generated during the same period in 2022. Table 2 below shows the monthly retail receipts of STL for this quarter.

## B. Jackpot Winners

For July to September 2023, PCSO made 20 instant millionaires for winning the jackpot compared to 15 jackpot winners during the same period in 2022. This quarter, the Agency released a total amount of P916,803,924.20 as jackpot prizes.

Eight (8) lucky players won a total of P197.38 million in the Lotto 6/42, while four (4) players won from the Grand Lotto 6/55 with a total of P235.75 million. For the Super Lotto 6/49 and Ultra Lotto 6/58, three (3) players for each game won a total of P125.42 million and P214 million respectively. Lastly, for the Mega Lotto 6/45, two (2) players won a total of P144.24 million.

From January to September 2023, there were already 67 jackpot winners, with P3.05 Billion allocated for their winnings.

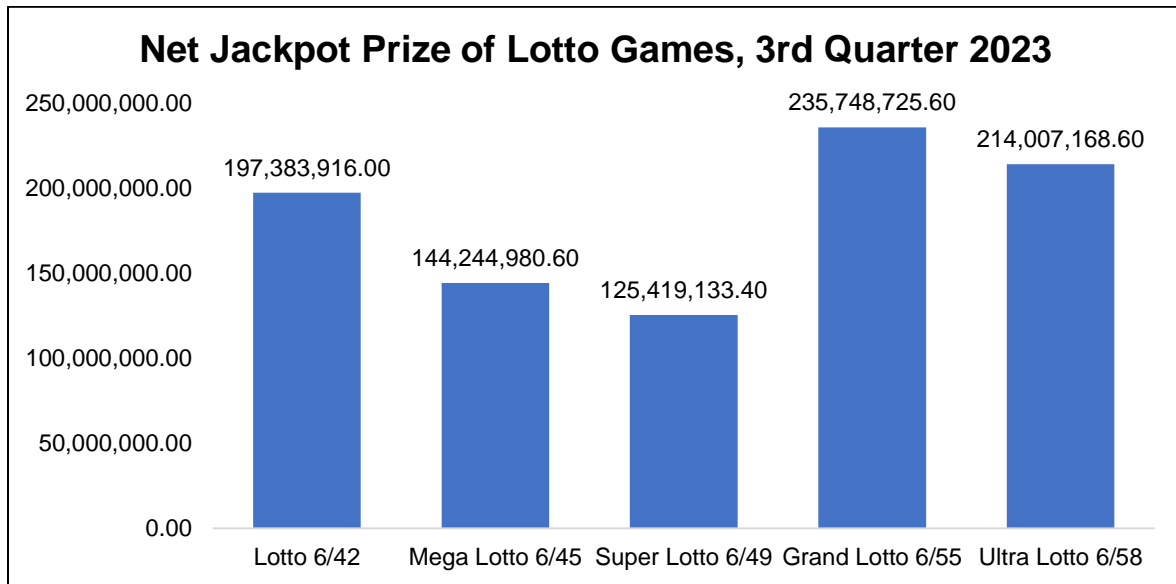


Figure 7 Total Jackpot Prize Winnings, 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter, 2023

Meanwhile, Figure 7 shows jackpot prize winnings from July to September 2023 where Grand Lotto 6/55 had the highest jackpot prize amounting to P235.75 million while the lowest jackpot prize winning is from the Super Lotto 6/49 with P125.42 million.

### C. Fund Provision Activities

The PCSO provides funds through its various charity, medical programs and services like the Medical Access Program (MAP), Medical Access in Malasakit Centers Program (MAM), Institutional Partnership Program, Medical Equipment

Donation Program, Medical transport Vehicle Donation Program and Medicine Donation Program, among others.

From July to September 2023, the PCSO assisted 72,256 individuals and 87 LGUs and institutions by providing a total of P453.34 million. Table 5 shows the performance of PCSO's charity programs for the reporting period.

The succeeding sections detail the accomplishments of PCSO's fund provision activities through its programs and services.

## 1. Charity Programs

### a. Medical Access Program

#### i. Regular Medical Access Program

The Regular Medical Access Program aids persons with health-related problems in partnership with government and private hospitals, health facilities, medicine retailers, and other partners. Services covered by the program are confinement, erythropoietin (dialysis injection), chemo drugs, specialty medicines, hemodialysis, laboratory (blood chemistry), diagnostic, and imaging procedures, and implant/medical devices.

Patients availing of the Regular MAP are served through the PCSO Head Office and Branch Offices nationwide. For the third quarter, the PCSO released P344.30 million as assistance to 58,133 beneficiaries under the MAP.

In terms of sex disaggregated data (SDD), there are 29,186 female beneficiaries (50.21%) and 28,947 males (49.79%) who received assistance from the MAP.

In terms of nature of requests, the most requested assistance is the payment for confinement expenses with 27,372 requests, followed by medicines for dialysis (Epo) with 22,694 requests. Ranking third is chemodrugs with 4,983 requests. The breakdown of requests is found in Table 6.

Comparing the regular MAP disbursements for the third quarters of 2023 and 2022 (Table 7), it can be noted that the amount of assistance decreased by 4% but the number of beneficiaries increased by 1%. This shows that PCSO was able to reach more clients even though the amount of assistance was limited.

## ii. Medical Access in Malasakit Centers (MAM) Program

In 2019, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte signed Republic Act No. 11463 or the Malasakit Center Act which seeks to establish Malasakit Centers in hospitals run by the Department of Health nationwide. These centers serve as a one stop-shop that provides financial and medical assistance to indigent and financially incapacitated. These centers are created for Filipinos to have convenient, free of charge, accessible and efficient medical services.

As of September 30, 2023, there are 159 Malasakit Centers supported by PCSO nationwide (Annex A). During the period, the PCSO assisted 8,389 beneficiaries from Malasakit Centers, with assistance amounting to P72.021 million. (Table 8).

### b. Institutional Partnership Program (IPP)

This program assists various welfare agencies and charitable medical facilities to further extend the charity services of the government, particularly the medical and health needs of the poor and disadvantaged sector in the local communities.

From July to September 2023, PCSO granted a total of P2.5 million to six (6) institutional partners, as follows (Table 10):

### c. Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program (MTVDP)

This program medical transport vehicles to the local government units located in the conflict-stricken areas and vulnerable communities and those geographically-isolated and disadvantaged areas to immediately and safely transport the patients to, from, and between locations with most efficient access to places of treatment by land, water and areas of rough and mountainous terrain.

From July to September 2023, PCSO donated 15 MTVs amounting to P31,669,000.00 to various local government units (LGUs).

#### d. Medicine Donation Program

Medicine Donation Program is the provision of basic medicines and supplies to support government and non-government organizations with their advocacies of providing efficient and effective medical and healthcare services.

For the third quarter of 2023, PCSO granted P2.74 million worth of medicines to 55 organizations.

#### e. Medical and Dental Mission Program

Through the Medical and Dental Mission, the PCSO provides medical consultations, basic dental services like tooth extraction, and basic medicines to various recipients.

From July to September 2023, the PCSO conducted 11 medical and dental missions in various areas where the agency provided P28,795.93 worth of assistance.

#### f. Multi-Specialty Clinic

PCSO launched its multi-specialty clinic on March 27, 2023 at the PCSO Head Office, Conservatory Building, Shaw Boulevard, Mandaluyong City. This program provides the public with free consultations from medical specialists such as cardiologist, neuropsychiatrist, pulmonologist, orthopedic surgeon, gastroenterologist, endocrinologist, ears, nose, and throat (ENT) doctor, and ophthalmologist.

For the third quarter of 2023, 640 patients availed of free medical consultations.

### g. Out-Patient Services

From July to September, 2023, the PCSO provided 1,543 patients with free consultations and P38,499.91 worth of medicines.

### h. Employees Consultation and Management

For the third quarter of 2023, PCSO provided 4,191 employees, their dependents, and retirees with free medicines, in-house consultations from PCSO doctors and medical and dental supplies totaling to P33,779.86.

## 2. Compliance with Mandatory Contributions

The PCSO also contributes to various agencies and institutions in compliance with various laws and issuances. For the third quarter of 2023, PCSO paid a total of P1,490,043,901.05 to these agencies.

## IV. Contributions to Nation-Building

### A. Tax Remittances

PCSO has been diligently paying its taxes to the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR).

The Agency paid a total of P3,969,871,704.11 to the BIR for the period July to September 2023. Bulk of the taxes paid represents the Documentary Stamp Tax (DST) amounting to P2.632 billion. Table 14 illustrates the breakdown of the taxes paid for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2023.

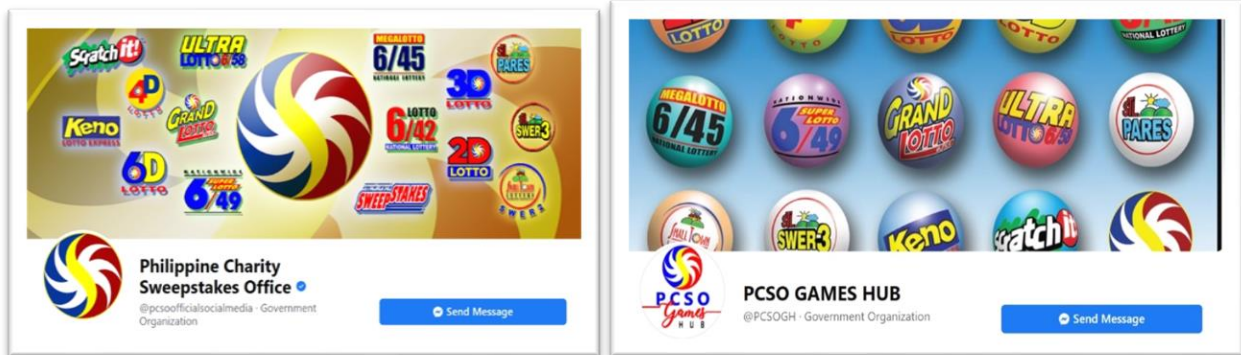
### B. Online Feedback
