I. Introduction

Pursuant to its mandate and guided by the principles of transparency, accountability, and good governance, the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) presents its Fourth Quarter Accomplishment Report covering the period October 1 to December 31, 2025.

This report highlights the Agency's notable operational achievements and administrative initiatives undertaken during the quarter, demonstrating PCSO's continued commitment to the effective delivery of charity and health-related services.

Through the accomplishments reflected in this report, PCSO affirms its unwavering dedication to raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance, and other charitable endeavors, while consistently upholding integrity, efficiency, and compassion in public service.

II. About PCSO

Section 1, Republic Act No. 1169, as amended, mandates that the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office shall be the principal government agency for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance and services, and charities of national character and as such shall have the general powers conferred in Section 13 of Act No. 1049, as amended and shall have the authority:

A. To hold and conduct charity sweepstakes races, lotteries and other similar activities, in such frequency and manner, as shall be determined, and subject to such rules and regulations as shall be promulgated by the Board of Directors.

B. Subject to the approval of the Minister of Human Settlements, to engage in health and welfare-related investments, programs, projects and activities which may be profit-oriented, by itself or in collaboration, association or joint venture with any person, association, company or entity, whether domestic or foreign, except for activities mentioned in the preceding paragraph A, for purpose of providing for permanent and continuing sources of funds for health programs, including the expansion of existing ones, medical assistance and services, and/or charitable grants, provided, that such investments will not compete with the private sector in areas where investments are adequate, as may be determined by the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA).

C. To undertake any other activity that will enhance its fund generation operations and fund management capabilities, subject to the same limitations provided for in the preceding paragraph.

Revenue Allocation

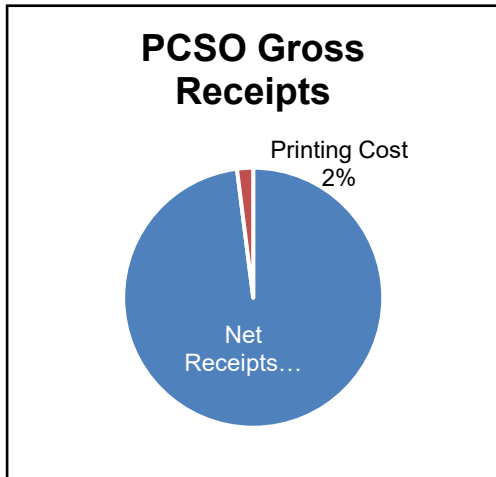


Figure 1. PCSO Gross Receipts

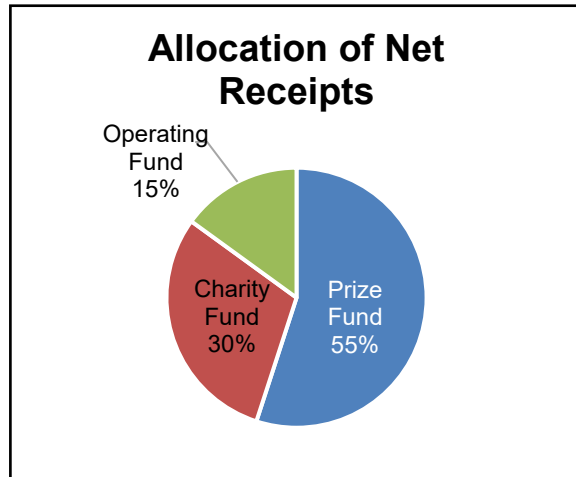


Figure 2. Allocation of Net Receipts

Section 6 of Republic Act No. 1169, otherwise known as the PCSO Charter, provides that the net receipts (gross receipts less 2% printing cost) as shown in Figure 1, is divided among three distinct funds: the Prize Fund at 55%, the Charity Fund at 30%, and lastly, the Operating Fund at 15% of the net receipts (Figure 2).

The **Prize Fund**, which accounts for 55% of the net receipts, is used to pay prizes for holders and sellers of winning tickets. Unclaimed prizes or balances in the Prize Fund revert to and become part of the Charity Fund after one (1) year.

The **Charity Fund**, which is 30% of the net receipts, is used exclusively to finance and support health programs, medical assistance and services, and/or charities of national character.

The **Operating Fund** consists of 15% of net receipts and is used to support the PCSO's day-to-day operating/maintenance and capital expenditures. Unutilized Operating Fund at the end of the fiscal year becomes part of the Charity Fund.

III. Fund Generation Activities

A. Sales Comparison between 4th Quarter, CY 2025 vs. 4th Quarter, CY 2024

During the fourth quarter of 2025, the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) generated total sales amounting to 16,530,596,516.44, reflecting an increase of P343,820,178.44 or 2.12% from the P16,186,749,338.00 total sales posted during the same period in 2024.

The modest growth in the overall sales was largely attributed to the strong performance of the Small Town Lottery (STL). STL sales reached P9,057,774,471.44 in 2025, exceeding the P8,491,080,658.00 sales posted in the previous year by P566,693,813.44, or 6.67% increase.

In contrast, Lotto and Digit Games experienced a slight contraction in sales during the period, declining from P7,433,168,680.00 in 2024 to P7,210,322,045.00 in 2025. Notwithstanding this decrease, these games remained significant contributors to PCSO’s total sales.

Sales from the National Instant Sweepstakes Program (NISP) remained unchanged at P262,500,000.00 for both 4th quarters of 2024 and 2025, providing a steady and consistent contribution to overall revenues.

Overall, the positive sales performance in the fourth quarter of 2025 was primarily fueled by the strong showing of the STL, alongside the continued contribution of Lotto and Digit Games, reflecting sustained public patronage of PCSO’s gaming offerings.

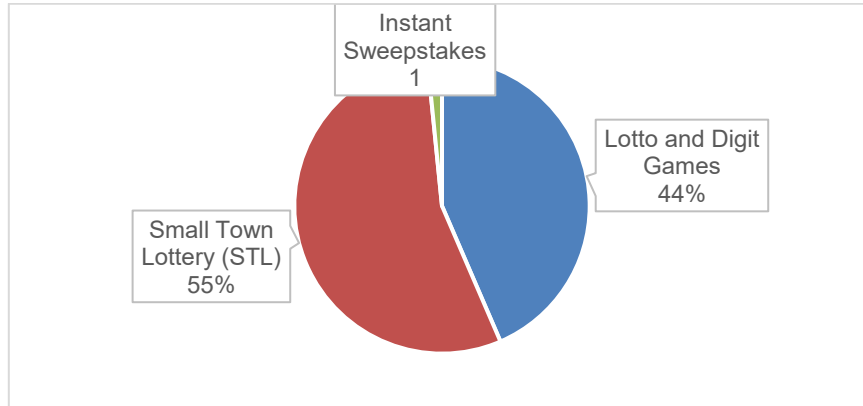


Figure 3. Distribution of PCSO Sales for the 4th Quarter of 2025

B. Percent Contribution of PCSO Games to the Total Revenue

In the fourth quarter of 2025, Small Town Lottery (STL) generated the largest portion of PCSO’s sales, accounting for approximately 55% of total revenue. Lotto and Digit Games followed as the second-largest contributor, comprising 43% of overall sales and continuing to provide a reliable revenue stream for the agency. The National Instant Sweepstakes Program (NISP) contributed a relatively modest share at 2% of total sales. With its sales remaining unchanged from the previous year, NISP continues to contribute a fixed and guaranteed amount to the agency’s overall earnings.

C. Sales Breakdown per PCSO Games

Small Town Lottery Retail Receipts, 4th Quarter, CY 2025

For the period October to December 2025, the Small Town Lottery-Authorized Agent Corporations (STL-AACs) nationwide generated P9,057,774,471.44 as contributions to the revenues of the agency. Table 2 details the monthly retail receipts of STL from October to December 2025 which shows an increase of 6.67% compared to the same period of 2024.

Lotto Jackpot Bearing Games Retail Receipts, 4th Quarter, CY 2025

During the fourth quarter of 2025, total retail receipts from jackpot bearing Lotto games amounted to P4,175,611,085.00, reflecting a 4.26% decline from the P4,361,663,280.00 recorded in the same period in 2024. The marginal decrease was largely influenced by reduced sales from Ultra Lotto 6/58.

Among the Lotto variants, Grand Lotto 6/55 registered the strongest performance, generating P1,129,475,540.00 in sales, a 49.30% increase year-on-year. This was followed by Super Lotto 6/49, which posted P931,565,945.00, marking a 29.20% growth compared to the fourth quarter of 2024.

Ultra Lotto 6/58 recorded P730,124,920.00 in retail receipts, representing a 48.89% decrease. Mega Lotto 6/45 also experienced a 9.14% decline, while Lotto 6/42 remained relatively stable, posting a marginal 0.17% decrease.

Overall, the sales performance of Lotto games in the fourth quarter of 2025 demonstrates mixed trends, with strong gains in selected variants partially offset by declines in others, which slightly reduced overall Lotto sales for the quarter.

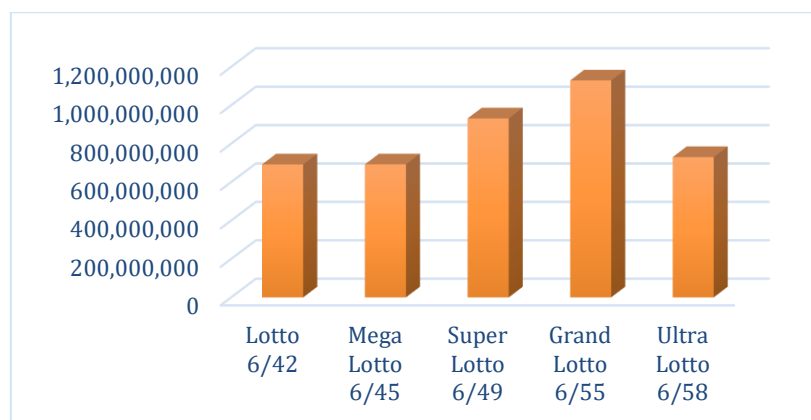


Figure 4. Lotto Retail Receipts per Game, 4th Quarter, 2025

During the fourth quarter of 2025, total retail receipts from Digit Games amounted to P3,034,710,960.00 with a slight decline from the same period in 2024. Among the Digit Games, 2D Lotto generated P1,753,853,390.00, which accounted for the largest share of total receipts for the period. This was followed by 3D Lotto, which recorded P1,043,909,450.00 sales. Meanwhile, 4D Lotto posted retail receipts of P127,110,830.00 while 6D Lotto contributed P109,837,290.00.

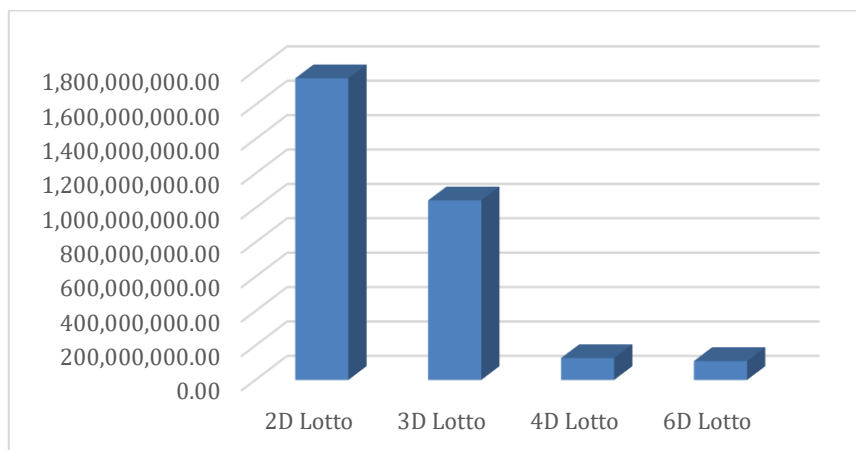


Figure 5. Digit Games Retail Receipts, 4th Quarter, 2025

IV. Changed Lives: Jackpot Winners for 4th Quarter, CY 2025

From October to December 2025, the PCSO produced fourteen (14) new millionaires, releasing a total of P916,004,096.20 in jackpot prizes.

Of the fourteen (14) jackpot winners recorded this quarter, five (5) winners were from Mega Lotto 6/45, followed by 6/42 with four (4) winners and Ultra Lotto 6/58 with three (3) winners. Super Lotto 6/49 and Grand Lotto 6/58 produced one (1) winner each.

V. Contributions to Nation-Building

Tax Remittances

PCSO continues to demonstrate its firm commitment to fiscal discipline, transparency, and good governance through the timely remittance of taxes to the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR). For the period October to December 2025, PCSO remitted a total of P4,178,331,766.87 in taxes to the National Government.

Documentary Stamp Tax (DST) remained the largest component of the total remittances, amounting to P3,308,869,363.29, reflecting the sustained volume of PCSO transactions and its strong revenue performance during the period. Other significant tax payments included Final Income Taxes on winnings (P251,488,166.64), Creditable Income Taxes Withheld Expanded (P216,574,073.09), Value-Added Tax and Other Percentage Taxes (P308,196,811.14), Taxes Withheld on Compensation (P99,323,812.53), and Corporate Income Tax (P2,911,767.00), all of which were fully paid within the prescribed periods.

PCSO's substantial and consistent tax remittances underscore its vital role as one of the government's major revenue contributors. These contributions directly support national development initiatives and help fund government programs, including charitable, health, and medical assistance services for Filipinos nationwide.

A detailed breakdown of the taxes paid during this period is provided below:

For the 4th Quarter of 2025, the total taxes paid amounted to P4,178,331,766.87, which is slightly higher than the P4,132,075,859.82 paid during the same period in 2024. This represents an increase of P46,255,907.05, or 1.12%, compared to the same period in 2024.

VI. Fund Provision

A. Charity Assistance Programs

During the Fourth Quarter of 2025, PCSO reinforced its mandate as a primary provider of health-related social services by sustaining and expanding the delivery of charitable and medical assistance nationwide.

Through the Medical Assistance Program (MAP) and other flagship initiatives, namely the Institutional Partnership Program (IPP), Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program (MTVDP), Medical Equipment Donation Program (MEDP), and Medicine Donation Program (MDP), PCSO ensured the continuous provision of critical support to patients, health institutions, and local government units.

For the period, PCSO extended assistance amounting to P1,852,897,643.57, benefitting a total of 66,154 individuals and 500 local government units and other partner agencies across the country. These interventions addressed urgent medical needs, strengthened the capacity of partner health facilities, and enhanced access to essential health services at the community level.

During the fourth quarter of 2025, PCSO sustained the implementation of its charity programs, providing financial and in-kind assistance to a wide range of beneficiaries nationwide. These interventions reflect PCSO's continued commitment to making essential medical and health-related services accessible, particularly to indigent and vulnerable sectors.

The Medical Assistance Program (MAP) remained the cornerstone of PCSO's charitable initiatives with a total amount of P943,568,500.43 extended to 60,017 beneficiaries, addressing various medical needs such as hospitalization, diagnostics, and treatment.

Beyond individual assistance, PCSO also supported health institutions and local government partners through the Institutional Partnership Program (IPP), releasing P7,347,000.00 to 11 partner institutions. The Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program (MTVDP) registered a significant contribution, with P899,020,000.00 worth of Patient Transport Vehicles (PTVs) donated to 399 beneficiaries. During the period, PCSO achieved its target of 100% LGU coverage in compliance with the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., enabling all LGUs in the Philippines to be equipped with one PTV each by the end of 2025.

Other community-based health initiatives were likewise implemented. Medical and Dental Missions assisted 2,033 beneficiaries. Multi-Specialty Clinic and Out-Patient Services catered to a combined total of 2,750 beneficiaries with a total of P170,001.24 assistance, providing preventive and curative health services. Additionally, Employees' Consultation and Management Services, including dependents, benefited 1,342 individuals with a total amount of P179,001.24, promoting workforce health and well-being. PCSO also extended support through donation of medicines, amounting to P2,239,318.13 for 73 LGUs. Medicines were also donated to Cebu as part of the caravan for the victims of earthquake which occurred on September 30, 2025. Patient Transport Services were likewise made available to those in need, ensuring access to medical care by such individuals requiring transportation to and from medical facilities.

Overall, the fund provision activities during the fourth quarter of 2025 demonstrate PCSO's sustained and multi-faceted approach to charitable assistance, covering medical treatment, institutional support, mobility, and community health services, and reaffirming its mandate to serve the health needs of the Filipino people.

1. Medical Assistance Program

Under MAP Regular, a total amount of P742,810,735.27 was provided to 50,539 beneficiaries, addressing various medical needs such as hospitalization, diagnostics, and treatment while assistance for catastrophic illnesses amounted to P5,870,558.88, benefiting 10 patients. Meanwhile, the assistance under Medical Assistance in Malasakit Centers (MAM) Program amounted to P194,887,206.28 for 9,468 beneficiaries.

Institutional Partnership Program

In the fourth quarter of 2025, PCSO continued to strengthen its collaboration with partner agencies through the implementation of the Institutional Partnership Program (IPP). This initiative supports organizations that provide direct services to institutions and agencies attending to the needs of individuals and communities in need. The assistance of PCSO intends to support the implementation of their programs and services and ensuring that PCSO's charitable efforts reach a wider range of beneficiaries.

During the period, PCSO disbursed a total of P7,347,000.00 in financial assistance to eleven (11) partner agencies across the country. This support underscores PCSO's sustained commitment to collaborative programs that promote community development and contribute to the improvement of public welfare.

Just before the end of the 4th quarter, PCSO achieved its target of equipping 100% of LGUs with one PTV each. The list of beneficiaries of the PTVs is attached as Annex A.

Medical and Dental Mission Program

The Medical and Dental Mission Program (MDMP) continued to deliver free medical and dental services to communities, including medical consultations, dental procedures such as tooth extractions, and the provision of essential medicines.



For the fourth quarter of 2025, PCSO successfully carried out twelve (12) medical and dental missions in various locations nationwide. These missions benefited a total of 2,033 individuals and amounted to P337,714.94 in medical and dental assistance.

Multi-Specialty Clinic

The Multi-Specialty Clinic Program sustained its delivery of accessible and quality healthcare services by offering free consultations with various medical specialists. For the period October to December 2025, the program served a total of eight hundred seventy-nine (879) patients, providing them with specialized medical care.

Out-Patient Services

The Out-Patient Services Program continues to extend vital healthcare assistance to the public. It caters to individuals seeking general consultation and dental care, as well as those in need of essential medicines.

From October to December 2025, a total of 1,871 patients benefited from the program's services. Through its medical and dental teams, PCSO ensured that patients received prompt consultations, proper medical advice, and free medicines with total expenses amounting P168,720.24.00



Employees Consultation and Management

PCSO continues to prioritize the health and well-being of its workforce through its Employees Consultation and Management Program. This initiative ensures that employees and their dependents have access to quality healthcare services without financial burden, fostering a healthy and productive workplace environment.

For the fourth quarter of 2025, a total of 1,342 employees and their dependents benefited from the program. They received free medicines, in-house medical consultations from PCSO physicians, as well as dental services and medical supplies. with the total amount of P115,261.63.

Patient Transport Services

During the fourth quarter of 2025, the PCSO facilitated the transport of twelve (12) patients, providing them with immediate medical assistance and helping reduce delays in emergency care. Each transport represents the agency's ongoing dedication to saving lives and improving access to critical healthcare services.

B. Compliance with Mandatory Contributions

PCSO continues to support various government agencies and institutions through contributions mandated by law. From October to December 2025, PCSO remitted a total of P826,106,167.41 in mandatory contributions.

C. Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Initiatives

PCSO, under its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Program, effectively carried out the nationwide distribution of food packs (Charitimba) to various local government units (LGUs). The initiative was designed to provide timely food assistance to communities, particularly those adversely affected by calamities and prevailing socio-economic conditions.

A total of 79 distribution activities were conducted from October to December 2025 across 14 regions nationwide, distributing 145,433 Charitimba with a total value of P101,167,380.00.

Lastly, PCSO distributed a total of 483 rescue devices including handheld radios, heavy-duty search lights, rescue helmets, rescue ropes, stretchers, and life jackets to various local government units during the period, with total assistance amounting to P4,740,272.00.

VII. Non-Financial Highlights

A. PCSO Activities

PCSO Leads Caravan for Typhoon Opong and Cebu Earthquake Victims

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) continues to bring aid and hope to thousands of Filipinos as it led a major Aid Caravan commencing on October 5, 2025 for the communities affected by Typhoon Opong in Masbate and the recent 6.9 magnitude earthquake in Cebu.

This nationwide humanitarian initiative, in partnership with the Metropolitan Manila Department Authority (MMDA) and Light Rail Transit Authority (LRTA), sent off over Php50 million worth of relief and medical aid composed of 18,220 Charitimba packs, 4,041 evacuation kits, 664 boxes of medicines, and 7,974 additional essential supplies from its Authorized Agent Corporations (AACs) of PCSO.

The joint initiative reflected the government’s timely and immediate response to such challenging circumstances and displayed the enduring spirit of bayanihan as agencies, donors, and volunteers come together to ensure that help reaches everyone.

PCSO Holds 2nd Charity Run

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) successfully held its second Charity Run on October 12, 2025, at Ayala Triangle Gardens, Makati City. The event was participated in by officials and employees from PCSO, representatives from various government agencies and the general public. Organized in partnership with RunRio, the activity reinforced PCSO’s commitment to promoting charity, health, and unity through sports.

The second PCSO Charity Run, with race categories of 3K, 5k, and 10K and 21K, attracted over 4,000 runners, marking a significant increase in participation



compared to its inaugural run in 2025. With doubled participation and strong public support, the event sets a promising precedent for future initiatives that combine fitness, fun, and philanthropy.

PCSO Celebrates 91st Anniversary

PCSO held its 91st Anniversary Celebration on October 30, 2025 with the theme: A Legacy of Service, The Strength Behind the Future: PCSO @ 91.

As a highlight of the celebration, PCSO honored employees who served the agency from ten (10) to forty-five (45) years. Individual employees and departments with excellent performance were also recognized during the event. PCSO likewise recognized four (4) government agencies, the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), Light Rail Transit Authority (LRTA), Office of the Civil Defense (OCD), and the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), for their invaluable support for the conduct of caravan for Typhoon “Opong” and the Cebu earthquake victims.

PCSO Leads the Observance of the 2025 National Day of Charity

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO), as the lead agency mandated to coordinate and supervise the nationwide observance of the National Day of Charity, spearheaded a series of charitable activities on October 30, 2025.

With the theme “Charity in Action – Building a Caring Nation,” PCSO organized various initiatives aimed at fostering compassion and social responsibility. In support of this advocacy, numerous government agencies, government-owned and controlled corporations (GOCCs), state universities, and local government units implemented aligned programs. These included health and dental missions, feeding programs, aid distribution, livelihood projects, environmental stewardship activities, volunteerism campaigns, and public information drives on disaster preparedness and social welfare.

PCSO Hosts Asia Pacific Lottery Association (APLA) Regional Conference

Following the election of PCSO General Manager Melquiades Robles to the Asia Pacific Lottery Association (APLA) Executive Committee in 2023, PCSO hosted the 2025 APLA Regional Conference on October 26–31, 2025 in City of Dreams, Manila. With the theme, “The Future of Lotteries: Thriving in an Era of Uncertainty”, the high-level conference brought together delegates, policymakers, and innovators from across the Asia Pacific to examine the evolving role of lotteries amid rapid technological change, market uncertainties, and the growing call for responsible gaming.

With a record of 240 delegates in attendance from the Asia-Pacific Region, the conference marked the largest participation so far, a testament to the global trust and international confidence in the Philippine Lottery System.

PCSO’s hosting of the event also underscores the Philippines’ growing role in the international lottery community and its commitment to transparency, integrity, and social responsibility. Through programs funded by lottery proceeds, the agency continues to provide critical support for healthcare, social welfare, and disaster response, demonstrating how gaming can be a force for public good.



PCSO Recognizes Kawanggawarriors

In recognition of the unwavering commitment to service of PCSO's partners, employees and volunteers, PCSO honored the exemplary contribution of STL Authorized Agent Corporations, PCSO employees, and volunteers for their vital role in fulfilling PCSO's mission of helping Filipinos in need during the Kawanggawarriors Night held on December 3, 2025 at the Philippine International Convention Center.

Led by Chairman Felix Reyes, GM Melquiades Robles, and the Board of Directors, the ceremony highlighted how these "KawanggaWarriors" serve as the backbone of PCSO's operations, ensuring timely assistance and support to communities nationwide. Their dedication and resilience make them true champions of public service.

B. Recognitions and Certifications

PCSO Honored Among Top 10 Government Owned and Controlled Corporations (GOCC)

PCSO was recognized by the Governance Commission for GOCCs (GCG) as the top Government-Owned and Controlled Corporations (GOCC) after achieving a 100.63% score on its 2024 Performance Evaluation Scorecard during the GCG Awards held on December 1, 2025. In addition, General Manager Melquiades A. Robles was named a finalist for the inaugural Leadership Award, a distinction honoring outstanding leaders among GOCCs.

The recognitions emphasize PCSO's ongoing commitment to excellence in governance, responsible gaming, and charitable service, highlighting the agency's role in promoting social welfare and delivering meaningful programs for the Filipino people.

Gender and Development Awards

PCSO's exceptional commitment in allocating and use of GAD budget to advance gender equality and women empowerment was recognized during the GAD Awarding Ceremony held on September 25, 2025. It achieved a milestone for receiving four (4) awards, topped by ranking 1st as the GOCC with highest attributed GAD expenditure. The other awards are:

- Rank 8: GOCC with highest attributed GAD allocation
- Rank 8: GOCC with highest total GAD budget allocation
- Rank 5: GOCC with highest total GAD budget expenditure

These recognitions affirm PCSO's strategic leadership in promoting gender-responsive governance and its steadfast commitment to inclusive development. Building on these achievements, PCSO remains committed to advancing gender and development initiatives that create lasting impact for generations to come.



Freedom of Information Award

PCSO was named First Runner-Up in the Freedom of Information Champion for Government-Owned and Controlled Corporations category at the FOI Awards held on November 28, 2025, in Alabang. Additionally, Ma. Ruchiella Jimenez, PCSO FOI Receiving Officer and Division Chief III, was honored as Best FOI Officer for her dedication and efforts in enhancing PCSO's FOI program.

These distinctions underscore PCSO's continual commitment to transparency and accountability, upholding the principles of open government generating trust and confidence among the public it serves.

PCSO Maintains its ISO 9001:2015 Certification

PCSO successfully passed the ISO 9001:2015 surveillance audit conducted by DQS Certification Philippines from December 3 to 5, 2025. Following a thorough evaluation, the auditors recommended the continued maintenance of PCSO's certification, reaffirming that its operational processes for charity and gaming services adhere to internationally recognized standards for quality management. This achievement underscores PCSO's commitment to delivering consistent, high-quality public service and strengthening trust in its mission of service to the Filipino people.

PCSO Achieves World Lottery Association (WLA) Level 3 Responsible Gaming Certification

PCSO attained WLA Level 3: Planning and Implementation Responsible Gaming Accreditation following the favorable recommendation of the Independent Assessment Panel (IAP) which conducted evaluation on the Responsible Gaming practices of PCSO submitted on September 30, 2025.

This achievement affirms that PCSO has established structured, measurable, and organization-wide mechanisms designed to promote safe play, protect players and address potential risks associated with gaming.

PCSO's Level 3 accreditation reflects its sustained commitment to transparent, fair, and socially accountable gaming, consistent with its mandate to generate funds for health programs, medical assistance, and other charitable causes.

VIII. Customer Feedback Mechanisms

As part of its commitment to transparency, accessibility, and responsiveness, PCSO actively utilizes the 8888 Citizens' Complaint Center Hotline. This mechanism facilitates the timely receipt and resolution of public inquiries, complaints, suggestions, and commendations, contributing to continuous service improvement.

A. 8888 Hotline

For the fourth quarter of 2025, PCSO attained a 100% responsiveness and timeliness rate in addressing concerns received through the 8888 Citizens' Hotline, demonstrating the Agency's continued commitment to transparency, accountability, and effective public engagement.
