I. Executive Summary

The organization's clear account of its performance over the past year CY 2025, reflects the underscoring commitment to strong financial stewardship and alignment with the priorities of the present administration. In a year marked by both challenges and opportunities, the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office delivered resilient growth, strengthened operational efficiency, and reinforced its role as a trusted partner in advancing national development objectives.

Guided by the President's vision and the priorities of the present administration, PCSO has remained steadfast in aligning strategies with national objectives while delivering strong financial results for stakeholders.

As revenues grew steadily, reaching a total gross revenue of Php64,863,260,200.88, operational efficiencies were strengthened to support initiatives aligned with national development goals that improve healthcare. By channeling more resources into medical assistance, hospital modernization, and support for charitable institutions, PCSO aligned its financial growth with its core mandate of nation-building. The sustained increase in revenue allowed the agency to expand its social service coverage, enhance the delivery of health-related interventions, and ensure that vulnerable sectors receive timely support.

Our financial achievements are not only a measure of profitability but also a reflection of our alignment with the President's vision for inclusive and sustainable growth. In 2025, PCSO achieved 100 percent distribution of patient transport vehicles to all 1,642 LGUs across the country. This translates to now having an available vehicle in every city and municipality, ready to save lives in critical moments.

Collaboration with stakeholders, partners, and government agencies have also been instrumental in driving innovation, expanding opportunities, and reinforcing confidence in the agency's capacity to contribute meaningfully to the country's economic agenda, while laying the foundation for future opportunities. Awarded the highest score among all government owned and controlled corporations in the Governance Commission for GOCCs' 2024 performance evaluation, posting a 100.63 percent rating, PCSO's efforts did not go unrecognized, another clear validation of excellence, integrity, and unwavering commitment to serving the Filipino people.

Looking ahead, PCSO remains dedicated to building on this momentum, ensuring that financial performance translates into enduring value for all stakeholders and supports the broader direction set by the Marcos administration, focused on a driving impact through responsible leadership.

Amidst the most challenging times marked by calamities and adversity, the remarkable success of PCSO in CY 2025 has shone a spotlight on everyday heroes who stepped beyond their comfort zones to make selfless sacrifices. Under the dynamic and proficient governance of its leadership team comprised of the Board of Directors, General Manager, Assistant General Managers, and Department Managers, the organization has been propelled to new heights of excellence. This achievement is

further strengthened by the unwavering commitment and teamwork of all PCSO employees, whose collective effort and unity stand as the cornerstone of the agency's greatest accomplishments, embodying the true spirit of the *Kawangwarrior*.

This report presents an overview of PCSO's achievements, highlighting how the organization successfully fulfills its dual mandate of generating funds and extending assistance to medical, health, and welfare programs, as well as other national charities.

II. Corporate Profile

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is a 100% Government -Owned and Controlled Corporation (GOCC) operating under the Office of the President.

In March 1935, then President Manuel L. Quezon approved Act 4130, a law passed by the Philippine Legislature in October 30, 1934, which established the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes to replace the former National Charity Sweepstakes. On June 18, 1954, Republic Act 1169 (PCSO Charter), was enacted to provide for the conduct of charity sweepstakes and lotteries once a month when no sweepstakes draws or races were scheduled.

Under Section 1, Republic Act No. 1169, as amended, the PCSO is designated as the principal government agency responsible for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance and services, and charities of national character. In line with this mandate, the agency is vested with the following authority:

- A. To hold and conduct charity sweepstakes races, lotteries and other similar activities, at such frequency and manner as determined by the Board of Directors, subject to applicable rules and regulations
- B. With the approval of the Minister of Human Settlements, to engage in health and welfare-related investments, programs, projects and activities that may be profit-oriented. These may be undertaken independently or in collaboration, association, or joint venture with any person, association, company, or entity, whether domestic or foreign. Such activities, excluding those mentioned in paragraph A, aim to provide permanent and continuing sources of funds for health programs, medical assistance, and charitable grants, provided that these investments do not compete with the private sector in areas deemed adequate by the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA).
- C. To undertake any other activity that will enhance its fund generation operations and fund management capabilities, subject to the same limitations provided for in the preceding paragraph.

Vision

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is the principal government agency committed to excellence in generating sustainable funds for health programs

and charities of national character through responsible gaming towards a prosperous, inclusive and resilient society.

Mission

- Hold and conduct transparent and sustainable gaming activities and continuously innovate and improve our products and services;
- Provide equal access, timely and responsive assistance to eligible recipients and beneficiaries;
- Develop and train our people's skills and environmental awareness towards operational resilience; and
- Establish strong partnerships with responsible agents and stakeholders.

Quality Policy

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is committed to the pursuit of quality, excellence, and continual improvement in the management of gaming products and charity programs in accordance with its strategic direction to meet stakeholders' needs and satisfaction contained in the Quality Management System in compliance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

To achieve this commitment, PCSO shall:

1. Sustain fund generation by maintaining the transparency, integrity, and credibility of all draw operations;
2. Ensure responsiveness of charity programs through rational fund provision;
3. Employ technological solutions to improve processes and address future needs of stakeholders; and
4. Promote the welfare of its workforce, including enhancement of their competencies.

Revenue Allocation

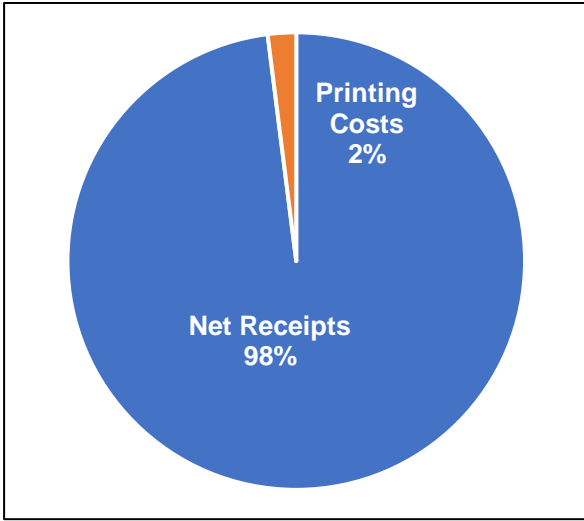


Figure 1. PCSO Gross Receipts

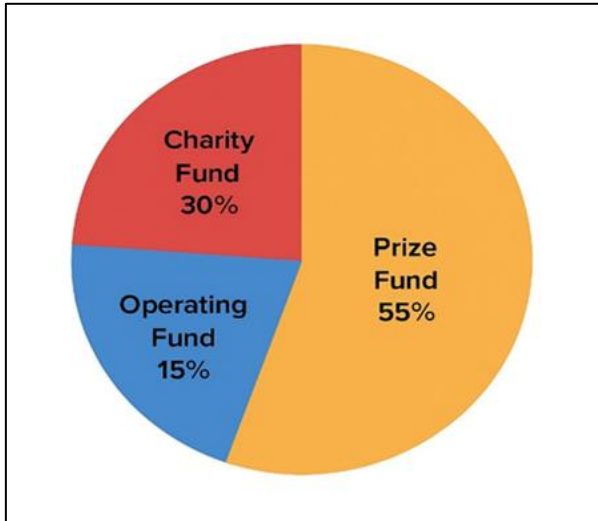


Figure 2. Allocation of the Net Receipts to the three (3) PCSO Funds

Section 6 of the PCSO Charter provides that from the gross receipts generated through the sale of sweepstakes tickets, whether for races, lotteries, or other similar activities, the cost of printing tickets not exceeding 2% is first deducted to determine the net receipts (Figure 1). The net receipts are divided among three distinct funds: the Prize Fund at 55%, the Charity Fund at 30%, and the Operating Fund at 15% (Figure 2).

The **Prize Fund** is designated for the payment of prizes, including those awarded to owners and jockeys of winning horses, as well as sellers of winning tickets. It is classified as a trust liability account. Any unclaimed prizes or remaining balances in the Prize Fund revert to and become part of the Charity Fund after one (1) year.

The **Charity Fund**, also a trust liability account, is exclusively allocated to finance and support health programs, medical assistance and services, and charities of national character. At present, all disbursements from the Charity Fund require approval from the Office of the President, or the PCSO Board of Directors, based on amounts delegated by the Office of the President.

The **Operating Fund**, which comprises 15% of the revenue allocation, is utilized to cover the daily operational, maintenance, and capital expenditures of the PCSO. Any remaining balance in the Operating Fund at the end of the fiscal year reverts to and becomes part of the Charity Fund.

III. Financial Highlights

A. Fund Generation Activities

1. Sales Comparison between CY 2025 vs. CY 2024

A comparison of sales between CY 2025 with the previous year highlights a notable improvement, with retail receipts in CY 2025 rising 4.03% higher than those recorded in CY 2024.

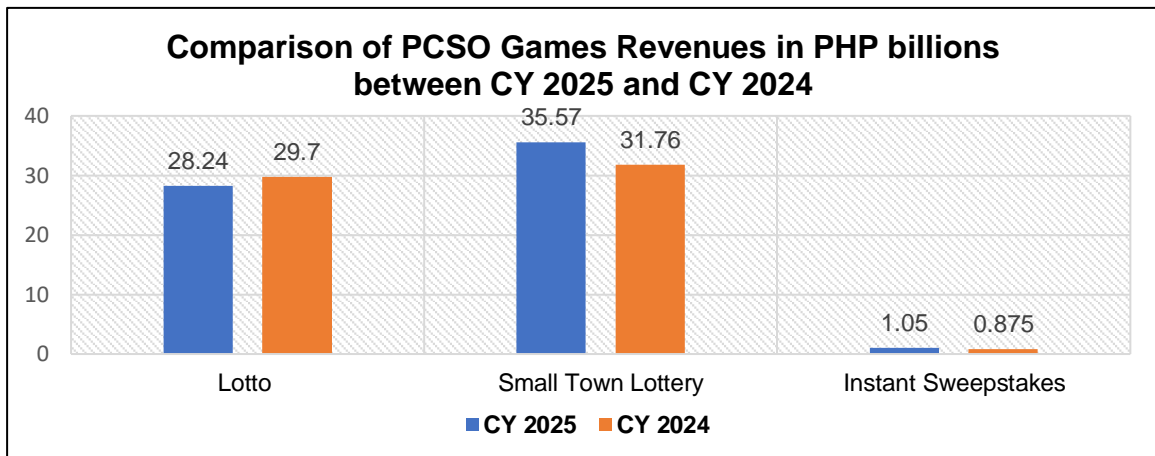


Figure 3. Comparison of PCSO Games Gross Retail Receipts, CY 2025 vs. CY 2024

Figure 3 represents a comparative illustration of retail receipts per PCSO game for CYs 2025 and 2024. PCSO’s total gaming sales in 2025 reached P64.86 billion, reflecting an overall increase of P2.41 billion compared with P62.35 billion in 2024. This growth indicates a generally positive performance across major gaming products, despite mixed trends among individual categories.

Among the games, Small Town Lottery (STL) demonstrated a strong and notable growth. Sales increased significantly from P31.76 billion in 2024 to P35.57 billion in 2025, an improvement of approximately P3.81 billion. This substantial rise highlights STL’s expanding market reach and continued effectiveness as a revenue driver. Similarly, Instant Sweepstakes showed positive performance, with sales increasing from P875 million in 2024 to P1.05 billion in 2025, or an increase of P175 million. In contrast, Lotto declined by P1.47 billion (-5%) from P29.72 billion in 2024 to P28.24 billion in 2025.

2. Sales Breakdown of Lotto Games

The chart shows that in CY 2025, Grand Lotto 6/55 generated the highest retail receipts at P3.94 billion, followed closely by Ultra Lotto 6/58 at P3.91 billion, a very close margin indicating strong and nearly equal market demand for both major jackpot games. Super Lotto 6/49 ranks third with P3.06 billion, showing a noticeable drop from the top two, but still demonstrating solid performance. Lotto 6/42 and Mega Lotto 6/45 trail behind with P2.92 billion and P2.69 billion, respectively, suggesting that lower-jackpot games generate comparatively less revenue but remain significant contributors.

Overall, the data indicates that games with larger jackpot formats (6/55 and 6/58) continue to drive the highest sales, reflecting player preference for higher-stakes lotto variants.

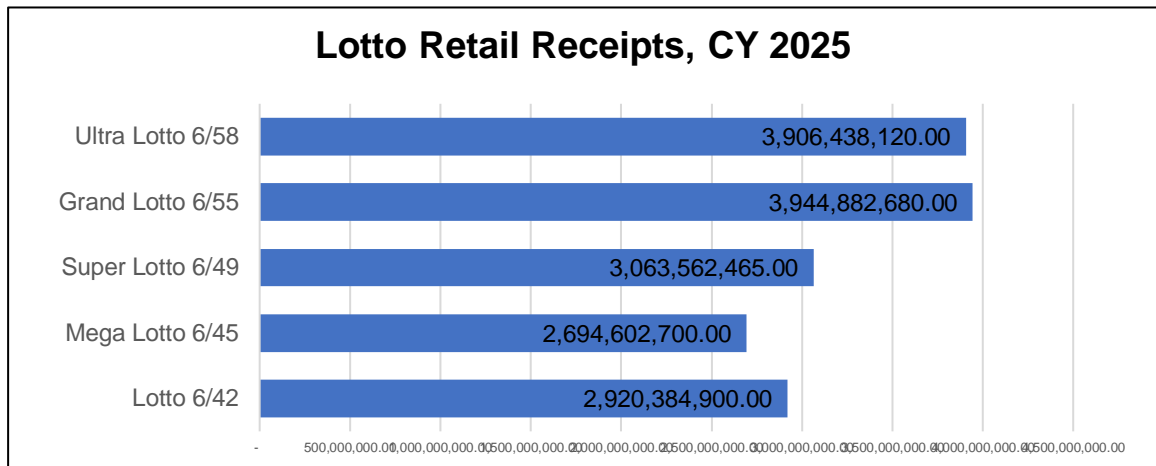


Figure 4. Breakdown of PCSO Lotto Sales in CY 2025

For the Digit Games which generated a total of P11,713,102,040.00 for CY2025, the 2D led all games with total receipts of P6.64 billion, becoming the primary revenue driver of digit games. Its strong performance indicates continued popularity among players. This is followed by 3D Lotto which contributed P4.17 billion, reinforcing its position as the second most significant revenue source. While smaller than 2D Lotto, its receipts remain substantial and consistent. In contrast, the higher-digit games, 4D Lotto and 6D Lotto, have lower contribution of P484.05 million and P413.79 million, respectively.

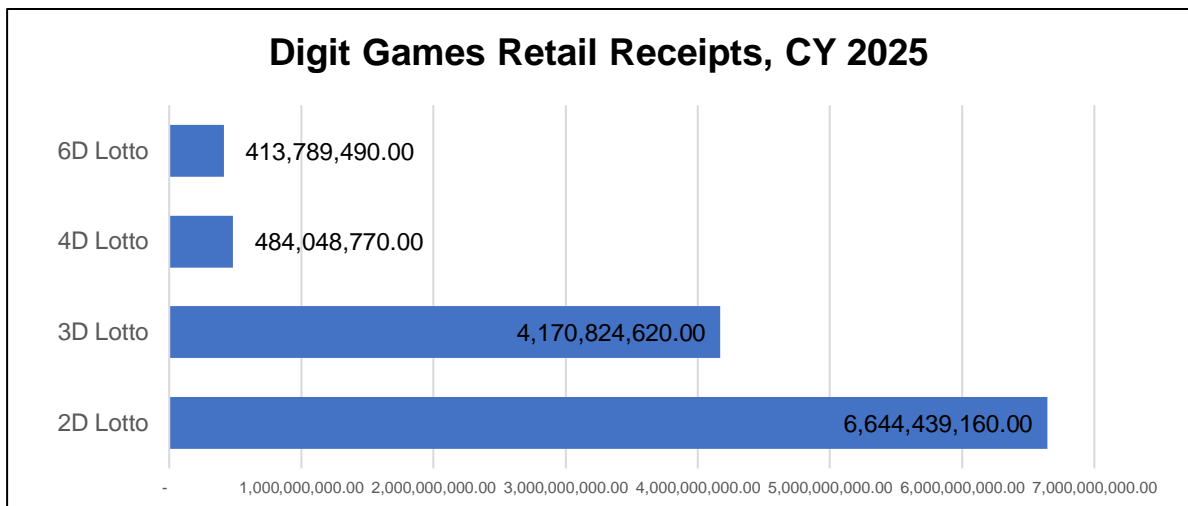


Figure 5. Digit Games Retail Receipts for CY 2025

3. Percent Contribution of PCSO Games to the Total Revenue

In 2025, STL stood out as the leading revenue generator, posting gross retail receipts amounting to P35,570,287,295.88. Lotto ranked second to STL as major revenue contributors, generating gross retail receipts of P28,242,972,905.00, followed by the

Instant Sweepstakes which contributed P1,050,000,000.00 providing a steady revenue support stream to the agency.

STL's performance, contributing more than half of the total revenues, underscores its continued dominance and sustained market demand, particularly in local communities where the game maintains a strong grassroots presence. Its revenue level suggests both high player participation and consistent operational performance across authorized agent corporations.

The Lotto games, while slightly behind STL, still delivered a significant 43.54% share, demonstrating their continued relevance as core products of PCSO. This performance reflects stable customer engagement, supported by regular draws, diverse game options, and attractive jackpot-driven participation spikes.

The Instant Sweepstakes accounts for a comparatively smaller share but provides reliable supporting revenue. Its fixed contribution structure and predictable income stream help reinforce the agency's financial stability. Despite its lower proportion relative to other games, its role remains important in diversifying revenue sources and mitigating reliance on the two major game categories.

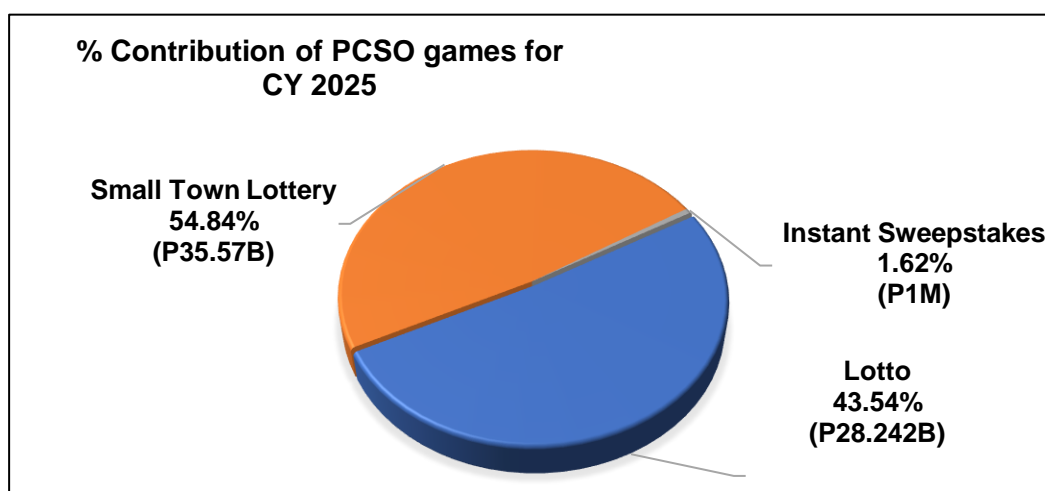


Figure 6. Percent Contribution of PCSO Games to the Total Revenue

B. Changed Lives: Jackpot Winners for 2025

The CY 2025 lotto results demonstrate PCSO's significant impact on beneficiaries and bettors alike, with 59 jackpot winners collectively receiving nearly P3.8 billion in prizes.

Ultra Lotto 6/58 generated the largest pay-out, trailed behind by Grand Lotto 6/55 despite having fewer winners. This highlights the expected high-risk, high-reward nature of lotto games. In contrast, Lotto 6/42 and Mega Lotto 6/45 produced most winners with small individual shares. Overall, the report shows a healthy balance across PCSO game offerings, rewarding both high-stakes players and those participating in lower-matrix draws while reinforcing PCSO's role in uplifting lives through substantial lottery winnings.

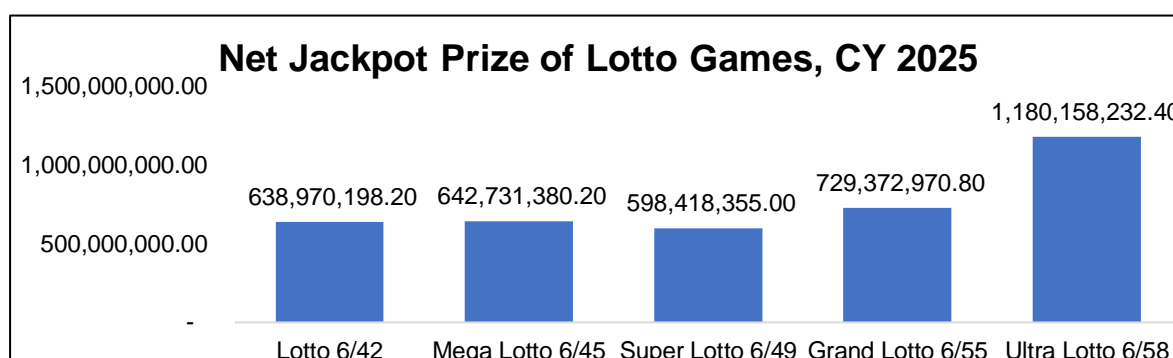


Figure 7. Total Jackpot Prize Winnings for CY 2025

C. Fund Provision

PCSO is mandated to generate and provide funds for a broad range of charity programs, including direct assistance to indigent patients, collaboration with local government units, and partnerships with other government agencies.

1. Charity Assistance Programs

PCSO currently implements a variety of individual and institutional programs designed to support indigent and financially challenged individuals in need of medical and financial assistance.

In 2025, eleven (11) primary programs were funded through the Charity Fund, namely:

- *Medical Assistance Program (MAP), delivered through the*
 - a. *PCSO offices*
 - b. *Malasakit Centers*
 - c. *Medical Assistance Program for Catastrophic Illnesses*
- *Institutional Partnership Program*
- *Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program*
- *Medical Equipment Donation Program*
- *Medicine Donation Program*
- *Multi-Specialty Clinic*
- *Out-patient Services*
- *Medical and Dental Mission*
- *Special Mission*
- *Employees Consultation and Management*
- *Patient Transport Services.*

From January to December 2025, PCSO provided charity assistance and medical services to 251,477 individuals and 1,300 local government units (LGUs), with total support amounting to P5,779,715,217.77.

Table 4 highlights the comparative performance of PCSO's charity programs for CYs 2025 and 2024.

PCSO recorded a 36.97% increase in assistance to individuals and LGUs in 2025, driven largely by the Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program, which saw a 153% rise in Patient Transport Vehicle (PTV) donation totaling 1,090 units compared to 431 in the previous year. This expansion underscores PCSO's commitment to fulfilling President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive of achieving full LGU coverage by year-end.

Overall, the 2025 fund provision data highlights PCSO's strengthened focus on enhancing community health logistics and sustaining individual medical aid. It reflects a strategic shift toward high-impact, long-term initiatives that improve healthcare accessibility and resilience across communities.

The succeeding sections show PCSO's fund provision activities through its charity programs and services.

a. Medical Assistance Program

The Medical Assistance Program (MAP) is the flagship initiative of PCSO, designed to provide financial support to individuals in need of medical care. As a cornerstone of PCSO's commitment to public welfare, the program extends aid through the issuance of Guarantee Letters in partnership with government and private hospitals, healthcare facilities, pharmaceutical retailers, and other accredited stakeholders. This mechanism ensures accessibility and efficiency in delivering medical support.

The program continues to exemplify PCSO's unwavering dedication to public health and social welfare by offering essential financial assistance to patients facing medical challenges. In 2025, the program's reach was further strengthened through sustained collaboration with hospitals, health facilities, medicine retailers, and other partners, ensuring efficient and responsive service delivery, underscoring its vital role in supporting the health needs of the Filipino people.

To ensure targeted and efficient delivery of aid, the Medical Assistance Program (MAP) is structured into three categories:

- Regular MAP – Direct medical assistance provided through PCSO’s head and branch offices nationwide.
- Medical Assistance in Malasakit Centers (MAM) Program – Support extended via Malasakit Centers, streamlining access to medical aid through one-stop service hubs in government hospitals.
- Medical Assistance Program for Catastrophic Illnesses - PCSO also extends support for illnesses categorized as catastrophic illnesses, requiring management and treatment that entails huge amounts of money, particularly kidney and liver transplants as well as Coronary Artery Bypass Graft (CABG) procedures.

Together, these programs reflect PCSO’s mission to make healthcare more accessible, efficient, and compassionate for all Filipinos.

The program demonstrates PCSO's substantial role in bridging healthcare gaps for financially vulnerable patients. With over 236,000 individuals assisted and P3.245 billion in aid released across diverse medical needs, the program reflects both wide coverage and deep financial impact. Confinement, chemotherapy support, and diagnostic procedures dominate the assistance profile, indicating that critical and chronic illnesses, particularly cancer and hospitalization-related conditions, remain the primary drivers of medical financial hardship. Although the majority of funds go to these high-volume requests, the program also covers high-cost, low-volume cases such as catastrophic illnesses, ensuring that even patients with rare or extremely expensive conditions receive meaningful support reflecting that PCSO's intention is to safeguard everyone that is in dire need of assistance.

Gender distribution shows a balanced reach, with a slightly higher share for female patients both in cases and funding.

b. Institutional Partnership Program

The Institutional Partnership Program (IPP) extends financial assistance to health and welfare institutions that directly serve vulnerable and underserved groups, including malnourished children, persons with disabilities, senior citizens, abandoned and orphaned children, at risk or out of school youth, and other marginalized sectors.

Through PCSO's funding support, partner institutions are able to sustain and expand critical programs such as nutritional supplementation, shelter and residential care, health and medical services, educational programs, livelihood initiatives, and various other interventions essential to their beneficiaries' well-being.

By empowering these organizations, PCSO effectively multiplies its reach and impact. These institutions become active partners in delivering PCSO's charitable mandate, ensuring that assistance flows directly to communities and individuals who need it the most.

In 2025, PCSO disbursed a total of P24,647,000.00 in financial assistance to thirty-eight (38) partner agencies across the country. This support underscores PCSO's sustained commitment to collaborative programs that promote community development and contribute to the improvement of public welfare.

c. Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program

The Medical Transport Vehicle Donation Program (MTVDP) provides Patient Transport Vehicles (PTVs) to provinces, municipalities, and cities, particularly those in calamity-stricken or vulnerable communities, as well as Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDA). These vehicles are essential for the safe and timely transport of patients requiring immediate medical treatment to, from, and between healthcare facilities.

The program is designed to enhance access to healthcare by equipping local government units (LGUs) with PTVs, ensuring that patients in remote and underserved communities can reach medical services without delay. Its long-term goal is to provide at least one PTV to every city and municipality nationwide, bridging gaps in medical transport services and improving health outcomes across the country.

In 2025, PCSO donated 1,090 PTVs to LGUs nationwide, with a total value of P2,484,469,000.00 against the 431 units released in 2024. The significant increase in the number of donated PTV donations underscores the agency’s commitment to meeting the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to PCSO to ensure 100% LGU coverage by end 2025. The list of LGUs beneficiaries is attached as Annex A.

d. Medical Equipment Donation Program

The Medical Equipment Donation Program (MEDP) is designed to provide essential and appropriate medical equipment to eligible government health facilities. The program supports hospitals and healthcare institutions by supplying vital equipment needed to enhance diagnostic and treatment services capabilities of these institutions, enabling them to deliver quality, safe and affordable healthcare services to indigent patients and other vulnerable population groups.

For CY 2025, PCSO donated one X-ray machine with 2D echo worth P7,330,000.00 each to three hospitals in the province of Pampanga, as shown below:

e. Medicine Donation Program

The Medicine Donation Program provides essential medicines and supplies to government and non-government, non-profit organizations, as well as health facilities. This initiative supports their advocacy of delivering efficient and effective healthcare services, enabling them to extend assistance to individuals in need.

From January to December 2025, the agency donated medicines valued at P2,260,665.62 to 75 local government units (LGUs) and health/government facilities nationwide.

f. Multi-Specialty Clinic

The Multi-Specialty Clinic continues to provide free medical consultations to the public, offering specialized services from experts in various fields, including cardiology, neuropsychiatry, pulmonology, orthopedic surgery, gastroenterology, endocrinology, otolaryngology (ENT), and ophthalmology.

For CY 2025, a total of 2,866 patients benefited from free consultations with medical specialists, underscoring PCSO's continued commitment to ensuring accessible and quality healthcare for the Filipino people.

g. Out-Patient Services

The Out-Patient Services Program provides free medical and dental consultations, minor surgical procedures, and essential medicines to individuals requiring ambulatory care.

In 2025, a total of 6,550 patients benefited from these services, with PCSO's medical and dental teams ensuring prompt consultations, proper medical advice, and free prescribed medicines. Total assistance amounted to P250,489.50.

h. Medical and Dental Mission

Through the Medical and Dental Mission, PCSO delivers free medical consultations, basic dental services such as tooth extractions, and essential medicines to individuals with medical and dental needs.

In CY 2025, the agency conducted thirty-eight (38) medical and dental missions and forty (40) special missions in various areas where the agency assisted 7,363 individuals and provided P634,282.96 worth of assistance.

i. Employees Consultation and Management

The Employees Consultation and Management Program provides in-house medical and dental consultations, medicines, and supplies to PCSO employees, their dependents, and retirees. This initiative underscores PCSO's commitment to safeguarding the health and well-being of its workforce by ensuring access to quality

healthcare services without financial burden, thereby fostering a healthy and productive workplace environment.

In CY 2025, 5,890 patients benefited from the program. The total assistance valued at P176,264.50 were utilized for free medicines, in-house consultations with PCSO physicians, dental services, and medical supplies.

j. Patient Transport Services

PCSO’s Patient Transport Services ensures rapid and safe ambulance transfers for patients in emergencies, staffed by paramedics trained to deliver life-saving care en route. In addition to emergency response, the service provides immediate medical transport between homes and healthcare facilities, catering to a total of 24 cases, underscoring PCSO’s commitment to timely and accessible healthcare for individuals in critical conditions.

2. Corporate Social Responsibility Initiatives

In line with its slogan “*PCSO, Hindi Umuurong sa Pagtulong,*” PCSO significantly expanded its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives in 2025, delivering medical, mobility, food, and emergency assistance to communities nationwide through two flagship programs.

- a. The Rear, Assist, Inspire, Support and Enhance (RAISE) – A program that focuses on alleviating the plight of the poor, sick, vulnerable, and marginalized sectors of society, including women, children, youth, senior citizens, persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples, refugees, migrants, minorities, and informal settlers. Assistance is provided in the form of food packs, mobility aids, medical devices, and hygiene kits, ensuring that essential needs are met for those most at risk.
- b. Disaster Preparedness and Relief Program – Complementing the RAISE, this program delivers immediate aid to disaster-stricken communities. These include food packs, hygiene kits, evacuation supplies, and rescue equipment distributed to local government units and affected areas during typhoons, floods, and other natural calamities. The program strengthens community resilience and enhances the capacity to save lives in times of crisis.

In 2025, Charitimba distributions grew by 59%, while medical and mobility assistance surged by 88%. These notable increases highlight the agency's intensified commitment to addressing the needs of marginalized groups and vulnerable sectors. The launch of the Emergency and Disaster Response Program further reinforced community preparedness, providing vital support to areas frequently affected by calamities.

Across all categories, PCSO distributed 20,724 items worth approximately P42.31 million. The balanced allocation across mobility aids, medical and rescue devices, and evacuation kits reflects a wholistic CSR approach, addressing health, mobility, safety, and disaster preparedness. This strategic distribution significantly contributes to strengthening community welfare infrastructures and supporting vulnerable populations nationwide.

3. Contributions to Nation-Building

A. Taxes Paid

In compliance with its mandate, PCSO remitted substantial tax contributions to the national government, reinforcing its role as a partner in nation-building. These remittances directly support public programs and services, including healthcare, education, infrastructure, and social welfare initiatives.

For the reporting period CY 2025, PCSO’s tax payments reflect its continued commitment to precision, culpability, and equitable distribution of resources. By channeling revenues back to the government, PCSO ensures that the benefits of its operations extend beyond charity programs, contributing to the broader development and well-being of the Filipino people.

The Documentary Stamp Tax (DST) represents the largest share of PCSO’s tax payments, accounting for 76% of its total outflows. This reflects the agency’s core operations, where the issuance of lottery tickets consistently generates DST liabilities, aligning directly with PCSO’s mandate and business model.

B. Mandatory Contributions Paid

In compliance with statutory requirements, PCSO remitted its mandatory contributions to designated government agencies and institutions during the reporting period. These contributions represent a significant portion of PCSO's revenues and are directed to programs that strengthen public health, social welfare, and community development.

PCSO's mandatory contributions support government programs and mandated beneficiaries across key sectors, ensuring that its operations not only sustain its own charity programs but also reinforce broader government initiatives aimed at improving public welfare and community development.

In 2025, PhilHealth received the largest share of PCSO's mandatory contributions at P2.69 billion under the Universal Health Care Act, followed by the Department of Finance with P1.76 billion in dividends.

IV. Non-Financial Highlights

A. Activities

Responsible Gaming Awareness Day

PCSO marked the first ever Responsible Gaming Awareness Day on March 10, 2025 with the theme, *“Play Smart, Play Safe”*. For the first time Responsible Gaming not only had a clear identity, but its own logo and message. The event served as a comprehensive platform to promote awareness and education on responsible gaming practices, emphasizing on the importance of moderation, self-control, and informed decision-making in gaming activities, ensuring that gaming remains a safe form of entertainment while continuing to support charitable programs.

Awareness efforts included the distribution of brochures and infographics, display of tarpaulins in all PCSO branch offices, use of official Facebook frames and logos, release of articles and press statements across social media platforms, and the launch of campaign hashtags #PlayResponsibly and #GamingAwareness. These initiatives provided the public with practical tools to recognize the risks of excessive gambling and access available support systems. The campaign also strengthened PCSO’s collaboration with government agencies, healthcare providers, and community organizations, reinforcing a network of assistance for individuals and families affected by gambling-related concerns. In addition, gaming partners demonstrated solidarity by wearing official Responsible Gaming shirts, further amplifying the advocacy.

The event’s success highlighted PCSO’s proactive role as a socially responsible gaming operator. By fostering awareness and encouraging responsible behavior, PCSO continues to uphold its mission of ensuring that gaming contributes positively to public welfare and national development.

2025 Agent’s Summit

PCSO held its 2025 Agents’ Summit on May 13, 2025 at the newly inaugurated Foro de Intramuros, Manila, gathering around 510 Lotto agents and STL agents from across the country. With the theme *“Beyond the Jackpot: A Commitment to Responsible Gaming,”* agents, law enforcers, regulators and experts sat under one roof to emphasize the crucial role of agents in promoting ethical gaming practices, protecting players, and combating illegal gambling operations.

PCSO GM Melquiades A. Robles emphasized that agents are not only operators but also advocates of responsible gaming. Discussions highlighted novelty, integrity, and public trust as foundations for modernizing lottery operations. Police Major General Nicolas D. Torre III, Chief of the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG), also spoke at the summit, reinforcing the importance of collaborative efforts in eliminating illegal gambling.

Overall, the 2025 Agents’ Summit successfully strengthened alliance between PCSO and its agents, showcased upcoming revolutions in gaming operations, and reaffirmed

the agency's commitment to balancing entertainment with social responsibility. The summit marked a significant step in redefining the future of lottery operations in the Philippines through ethics and community trust.

Conduct of PCSO 1st Social Workers Conference

The first Social Workers Conference of the agency was held on June 19–20, 2025 in Mabalacat City, Pampanga. The event gathered 81 PCSO social workers, branch managers, and key officials, including members of the PCSO Board of Directors, to reaffirm their collective commitment to delivering responsive and excellent public service.

The program featured upcoming initiatives to modernize PCSO's charity services, including an orientation on Republic Act No. 9433, the Magna Carta for Public Social Workers. Discussions emphasized the responsibilities and standards expected of social workers in their vital role as front-line service providers. Attendees also shared experiences and perspectives, working together to address emerging challenges in program implementation and service delivery.

PCSO Distributes 387 Patient Transport Vehicles Across Luzon in Historic One-Day Turnover

PCSO achieved a historic milestone on July 9, 2025 at the Quirino Grandstand with the largest-ever PTV turnover, recording the distribution of 387 Patient Transport Vehicles (PTVs) to various recipient municipalities across Luzon in a single day. This unprecedented turnover demonstrated the clear signal that the dream of *"Isang PTV sa bawat LGU"* is no longer distant, and is indeed happening, truly signifying PCSO's strong commitment to strengthening healthcare accessibility and supporting communities by providing reliable transport for patients in need.

The initiative was designed to expand the reach of PCSO's medical and health-related services, equip local government units and hospitals with vehicles to transport patients safely and efficiently.

The turnover was led by President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., together with PCSO officials, General Manager Mel Robles, and PCSO Directors Jennifer Liongson-Guevara, Janet De Leon Mercado, and Imelda Papin. The distribution of vehicles symbolized PCSO's dedication to bridging healthcare gaps and supporting communities beyond its gaming operations.

The impact of this initiative was immediate and far-reaching. The historic one-day turnover combined with other regional distributions nationwide, contributed to the full completion of the program's target, delivering on the President's directive to equip 100% of LGUs with at least one Patient Transport Vehicle by end of 2025. This initiative not only addressed urgent healthcare needs but also set a precedent for future programs that uplift communities and improve lives.

PCSO Charity Summit 2025: Strengthening Partnerships for Greater Public Service

The PCSO Charity Summit 2025, held on September 5, 2025, gathered over 250 stakeholders and partners, known as the “Kawanggawarriors,” to chart the future of the agency’s charitable programs. The summit highlighted ongoing initiatives, upcoming reforms, and PCSO’s mission of delivering responsive and compassionate service. Leadership messages emphasized innovation, openness, and accountability, while discussions focused on healthcare assistance, patient transport services, modernized program delivery, and responsible gaming advocacy.

General Manager Melquiades A. Robles reported that PCSO’s Medical Assistance Program has served nearly one million patients since 2022, extending P7.97 billion in aid, and reaffirmed the agency’s progress in fulfilling its mission of providing equal access and responsive assistance to Filipinos in need of medical assistance. The summit also recognized the contributions of partner organizations and reinforced collaboration across sectors.

The event concluded with a renewed commitment to integrity, compassion, and service excellence, celebrating past achievements while setting the direction for future initiatives that will continue to uplift communities and strengthen PCSO’s role in nation-building.

2025 PCSO Mid-Year Performance Review and 2026 Corporate Planning Workshop

PCSO held its 2025 Mid-Year Performance Review and 2026 Corporate Planning Workshop from September 10–12, 2025 in Laurel, Batangas. The three-day event brought together PCSO officials and key personnel to assess organizational performance for the first half of 2025 and to set strategic directions for the coming year.

The performance review highlighted accomplishments in revenue generation, charity services, and program implementation, while also identifying operational challenges and areas for improvement. Discussions were anchored on the agency’s commitment to transparency, efficiency, and innovation in delivering public service.

The planning sessions focused on aligning PCSO’s 2026 priorities with its long-term mandate of supporting health and welfare programs nationwide. Strategic initiatives were mapped out to modernize service delivery, strengthen partnerships with stakeholders, and enhance the impact of PCSO’s charity programs.

By combining a thorough review of past performance with forward-looking planning, the workshop reinforced PCSO’s role as a vital institution in nation-building. The event concluded with a unified commitment from participants to sustain excellence, accountability, and compassion in serving the Filipino people.

PCSO Leads Caravan for Typhoon Opong and Cebu Earthquake Victims

Following Typhoon Opong in Masbate and the 6.9-magnitude earthquake in Cebu, PCSO rolled out its first-ever PCSO Aid Caravan on October 5, 2025 - a 28-vehicle convoy delivering over P50 million worth of relief and medical assistance. Travelling by land and sea and in partnership with the MMDA, LRTA, and PCSO's Authorized Agent Corporations, the effort provided 18,220 Charitimba packs, 4,041 evacuation kits, 664 boxes of medicines, and 7,974 essential supplies to affected communities. The initiative demonstrated the government's swift response and the enduring spirit of bayanihan as agencies, donors, and volunteers united to ensure aid reached those in need. For the first time, disaster response was not just mission. It was a single, coordinated caravan of hope, moving as one national team.

PCSO Holds 2nd Charity Run

PCSO successfully held its second Charity Run on October 12, 2025 at the Ayala Triangle Gardens, Makati City. The event was participated by officials and employees from PCSO, government agencies and the general public. Organized in partnership with RunRio, the activity reinforced PCSO's commitment to promoting charity, health, and unity through sports.

The event which consisted of 3K, 5k, and 10K and 21K race categories, attracted over 4,000 runners, marking a significant increase compared to its inaugural run in 2025. With doubled participation and strong public support, the event set a promising precedent for future initiatives that combine fitness, fun, and philanthropy.

PCSO Leads the Observance of the 2025 National Day of Charity

On October 30, 2025, PCSO led the nationwide observance of the National Day of Charity, spearheading activities under the theme "*Charity in Action – Building a Caring Nation.*" The initiative fostered compassion and social responsibility through health and dental missions, feeding programs, aid distribution, livelihood projects, environmental efforts, volunteerism, and public information drives, with strong support from government agencies, GOCCs, state universities, and local government units.

d. Participation of PCSO Branch Offices with Lotto Agents, STL Authorized Agent Corporations, LGUs and Government Agencies in the Locality

Through the initiative of PCSO Branch Offices, lotto agents, STL Authorized Agent Corporations, Local Government Units, government agencies and other stakeholders organized charitable activities across various communities in celebration of the National Day of Charity. These initiatives benefitted indigent individuals, families, groups, and the general public, reflecting the agency’s commitment to compassion and service. A detailed report on the activities conducted by PCSO Branch Offices, Lotto Agents, STL AACs, and LGUs is provided in Annex B.

PCSO Hosts APLA Regional Conference

PCSO hosted the 2025 Asia Pacific Lottery Association (APLA) Regional Conference from October 26–31 at City of Dreams, Manila, following General Manager Melquiades Robles’ election to the APLA Executive Committee in 2023. With the theme “*The Future of Lotteries: Thriving in an Era of Uncertainty*,” the event gathered a record 240 delegates from across the region to discuss integrity, technology and the future of lotteries in Asia-Pacific.

The conference affirmed global confidence in the Philippine Lottery System and highlighted PCSO’s growing role in the international lottery community. It reaffirmed the agency’s commitment to transparency, integrity, and social responsibility, while showcasing how lottery proceeds continue to fund healthcare, social welfare, and disaster response programs, demonstrating gaming’s potential as a force for public good.

PCSO Recognizes Kawanggawarriors

Throughout 2025, one name came to embody the courage and compassion of PCSO’s frontliners: Kawanggawarriors. These are the PCSO employees and STL Authorized Agent Corporations who braved floods in Maguindanao, fires in Legarda and Tondo, and the devastation of typhoons and earthquakes in Cebu, Bicol, and beyond. They traveled overnight, crossed rough seas, and walked through mud and debris, knocking on doors with food, medicines, and comfort in hand.

Rooted in community involvement and volunteerism, the Kawanggawarriors initiative showcased PCSO’s employees and partners living out the spirit of *kawanggawa* (charity). Their efforts strengthened PCSO’s image not only as a gaming operator but also as a socially responsible organization dedicated to uplifting communities in times of need.

In recognition of these extraordinary acts, PCSO held the Kawanggawarrior Awards Night, the first formal stage dedicated to honoring these unsung heroes. Ordinary employees doing extraordinary things, their faces and names stand as proof that *kawanggawa* thrives in tired hands, muddy shoes, and brave hearts.

B. Responsible Gaming Initiatives

In 2025, PCSO advanced toward securing the World Lottery Association (WLA) Level 3 Responsible Gaming Certification, building on its Level 2 framework. Under the banner “*Play Smart, Play Safe,*” the agency integrated Responsible Gaming into employee training, game design, and stakeholder engagement, while expanding education campaigns and agent compliance programs. Partnered with gaming operators, technology providers, and broadcast partners, these efforts strengthened player protection and reinforced PCSO’s commitment to responsible play.

Following evaluation, the Independent Assessment Panel recommended awarding PCSO the Level 3 certification, affirming its significant progress and dedication to safeguarding the public.

The following are the initiatives of PCSO under RG for CY 2025:

i. Research Program

PCSO launched a research initiative entitled “Conduct of Nationwide Survey on Responsible Gaming for PCSO Games” on March 24, 2025 by distributing survey questionnaires across its branches nationwide. This effort reflects PCSO’s proactive approach to embedding Responsible Gaming (RG) principles into its programs and policies through evidence-based decision-making.

The survey was designed to gather critical insights on how players engage with PCSO games, their awareness and practice of RG behaviors, and the potential personal, social, and financial impacts of gaming.

With 518 respondents nationwide, the findings revealed that while many PCSO players are aware of Responsible Gaming messages, challenges remain. Areas of concern, such as spending more money on PCSO games than originally intended, financial and personal impacts, and a lack of information on how and where to seek help if they or someone they know is showing signs of addiction, highlight the need for improved responsible gaming campaigns.

These results provide PCSO with valuable evidence to enhance its RG campaigns, improve the visibility of support services, and design stronger policies to protect players. This accomplishment underscores PCSO’s commitment to proactive, research-driven, and socially responsible gaming operations.

On top of the survey conducted, the agency commissioned an external provider to conduct the Survey for Marketing and Responsible Gaming Data. Currently, the project is on track with an expected completion by January 2026.

ii. Employee Program

PCSO is committed to the continued enhancement of employees' understanding of responsible gaming principles, emphasizing accountability, social responsibility, and the protection of players and beneficiaries. The Responsible Gaming (RG) Training Program for PCSO personnel is embedded in the Training Program of the agency.

A total of 339 new hires and regular employees were given RG training for the year.

The post-test scores show a consistent increase in the knowledge improvement of participants indicating that the program content and delivery are effective.

iii. Retailer Program

Responsible Gaming (RG) modules are mandatory components of both onboarding and refresher training programs for PCSO retailers and STL-AACs (owners and tellers) ensuring their awareness on the expectations, compliance responsibilities and averting gaming-related harms. By end of 2025, a total of 7,023 existing and new lotto operators and STL AACs were given RG training and oriented on the violations and compliances required from them. In addition, a total of 4,341 lotto outlets were also provided with RG posters, extending the information dissemination to customers.

To ensure that lotto outlets are compliant with RG requirements, PCSO conducted audit on existing outlets. The audit on 3,320 outlets showed general compliance on posting of RG flyers and materials by lotto outlets.

Feedback from trainings and orientations conducted were gathered after the trainings and orientations as part of mechanisms to ensure retention of RG awareness. Based on the turn-out, feedback gathered exceeded the target of 6,874 target retailers.

Apart from the audit of retailers, PCSO implemented the Mystery Shopping Monitoring Program to monitor compliances with RG policies particularly age restrictions during betting and prize claiming transactions. The results covered 349 lotto outlets in the National Capital Region.

On concerns concerning transactions involving minors, out of 305 documented attempts to place a bet, only 75 outlets adhered to proper protocols, while a large

majority (230) remained non-compliant. The highest incident counts were concentrated in Quezon City, Caloocan, Parañaque, Manila, Pasig, and Las Piñas, indicating areas with heightened exposure and risk.

Similarly, for minors attempting to claim prizes, compliance was notably low. Of the 44 total cases, only 4 outlets refused the transaction aligned with Responsible Gaming standards, while 40 permitted the violation. Manila registered the most cases, followed by Quezon City and several other Metro Manila cities.

Overall, the findings highlight a significant gap in compliance, as majority of outlets failed to refuse transactions involving minors both in betting and in claiming prizes. The data reflects the urgent need for stricter enforcement of responsible gaming measures, particularly in highly concentrated areas such as Manila and Quezon City.

iv. Game Design and Development Program

Under the in-house development and implementation of new games, the conceptualization stage explicitly covers the assessment of the risk potential of proposed games. This ensures that any new offering is designed to pose only low to moderate risk levels for players, consistent with PCSO's commitment to responsible gaming.

With the approval of the Policy on Game Design which mandates the use of a structured monitoring tool for evaluating risk factors and tracking player behavior post-launch, the In-House Game Development and Implementation and Analysis of Existing Games Procedures, which are also certified under ISO 9001:2015, were revised to incorporate the principles of RG and include risk assessment, making them relevant to the current requirements of the agency. The enhancements aim to ensure a structured, transparent, and responsible process from game conceptualization to implementation.

In 2025, a total of 60 game proposals were reviewed with RG lens to check compliance with RG principles. Additional policies and procedures on responsible gaming were also either crafted or revised, such as:

- a) Responsible Game Research
- b) Responsible Game Design
- c) Responsible Gaming for Player Education

v. Advertising and Marketing

PCSO adheres to the Advertising Standards Council's Code of Ethics and have further strengthened governance in this area through the development of its own Responsible Gaming Advertising and Marketing Communication policy. It uses checklist to assess all communications against RG criteria which provides a consistent and structured review process and helps ensure compliance with both internal and external standards. PCSO's RG core messaging, Play Smart, Play Safe, is clearly articulated and consistently applied.

In 2025, PCSO implemented information campaign through various advertising platforms through wide-reaching visibility across outdoor, print, and online media. As a result, a total of 2,366,750 audience reach was recorded from these platforms. 105 Facebook posts on RG recorded 2,444,800 audience reach.

PCSO intends to increase the use of social media channel particularly as a means of reaching younger audiences and adapting messaging to contemporary consumption habits. More interactive, visual or story-based content shall be developed to improve engagement and recall of RG messages.

vi. Player Education

Several program and enhancements on existing initiatives were implemented to ensure sustained awareness of players, stakeholders, patrons and the general public on Responsible Gaming.

These included marketing campaigns through the integration of RG videos in lotto draws and RG video loops during in-house and sponsored events. RG materials were also included in branch-level video materials. PCSO also intensified the distribution of flyers and stickers to the gaming public/players with topics “Responsible Gaming”, “How to Play Responsibly” and the “Responsible Gaming+” sticker to lotto outlets, STL AACs and to the general public through these agents. A total of 2,544 Responsible Gaming and How to Play Responsibly flyers and RG 18+ stickers were distributed in 31 activities sponsored and participated by PCSO.

vii. Treatment Referral Program

PCSO established a multi-tiered treatment referral program for gaming-related harm which is currently in effect and publicly accessible. This enables the timely referral of individuals experiencing gambling-related harm to appropriate treatment services following screening and assessment. Referral protocols include confidentiality, motivational messaging and protocol orientation.

The following initiatives supporting the implementation of the program were developed:

- a. Training of employees on referral protocols, tracking, patient engagement, and follow-up care coordination. Referral partners include National Center for Mental Health (NCMH), and other DOH-accredited treatment centers nationwide.
- b. Directories for the referral program at the RG page of the PCSO Website.

viii. Stakeholders Engagement Program

Underscoring the importance of collaboration in shaping, implementing, and improving RG practices, PCSO significantly expanded its stakeholder engagement efforts, achieving the following milestones:

- Conducted 261 stakeholders Meeting on Responsible Gaming participated by 3,755 retailers, gaming partners and broadcast networks.
- Successful conduct of the 2025 Agents' Summit on May 13, 2025, attended by 510 retailers, featuring sessions on Responsible Gaming practices, digital transformation, launch of LottoMatik, and measures against illegal gambling.
- Feedback mechanisms were institutionalized: RG Feedback Forms were provided during orientations, re-orientations, and consultative meetings. By end of 2025, 6,890 feedback were collected from stakeholders, ensuring continuous monitoring and accountability.
- As a result of collaboration with law enforcement agencies, 1,140 illegal gaming social media sites were reported, some of which have already been taken down.
- Other initiatives such as the inclusion of RG materials in the broadcast by gaming/network partners during conduct of lottery draws and display of RG posters and giving out of flyers by lotto and STL agents, were initiated.

These accomplishments reflect PCSO's commitment to transparency, accountability, and shared responsibility, ensuring that Responsible Gaming remains at the core of its operations while fostering sustainable and responsible growth in partnership with all stakeholders.

C. Gender and Development Activities

PCSO implemented various Gender and Development (GAD) initiatives aimed at fostering inclusivity, gender equality and women empowerment. Extensive trainings were given to the GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) to ensure the efficient implementation of the approved GAD Plan and Budget for 2025. New employees and Job Order personnel were also provided with Gender and Sensitivity Trainings (GST) enabling them to acquire essential knowledge on gender sensitivity, inclusivity and equitable workplace practices.

PCSO also turned over hygiene kits on March 21, 2025 to First Love Ministries Philippines, Inc. for intended for the abused children in its care. Another turnover was conducted on June 11, 2025 for Barangay Bantug, Talavera, Nueva Ecija as part of PCSO's continuing support for women's health and well-being.

D. Recognitions/Certifications Received by PCSO

1. Gender and Development Awards

PCSO's strong commitment to advancing gender equality and women's empowerment was recognized during the GAD Awarding Ceremony on September 25, 2025. The agency achieved a milestone by receiving four awards:

- 1st place ranking as the GOCC with the highest attributed GAD expenditure.
- 8th place ranking for highest attributed GAD allocation
- 8th place ranking for highest total GAD budget allocation
- 5th place ranking for highest total GAD budget expenditure.

These distinctions affirm PCSO's leadership in promoting gender-responsive governance and inclusive development. Building on these achievements, the agency continues to strengthen its Gender and Development initiatives, ensuring lasting impact for future generations.

2. Freedom of Information Award

PCSO was recognized as First Runner-Up under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Champion, GOCC category during the FOI Awards on November 28, 2025, in Alabang, Muntinlupa City. In addition, Ma. Ruchiella Jimenez, PCSO FOI Receiving Officer and Division Chief III, was honored as Best FOI Officer for her dedication in strengthening the agency's FOI program.

These merits highlight PCSO's unwavering commitment to transparency and accountability, reinforcing the principles of open government and fostering public trust and confidence in its service.

3. Top 1 Government Owned and Controlled Corporations (GOCC)

PCSO was honored by the Governance Commission for GOCCs (GCG) as the top Government-Owned and Controlled Corporation, achieving a remarkable 100.63% score on its 2024 Performance Evaluation Scorecard during the GCG Awards on December 1, 2025. Additionally, General Manager Melquiades A. Robles was recognized as a finalist for the inaugural GCG Leadership Award, which celebrates outstanding leaders in the GOCC sector.

These honors emphasize PCSO's steadfast commitment to excellence in governance, responsible gaming, and charitable service, reaffirming its vital role in advancing social welfare and delivering impactful programs for the Filipino people.

4. PCSO Maintains ISO 9001:2015 Certification

PCSO successfully passed the ISO 9001:2015 surveillance audit conducted by DQS Certification Philippines from December 3–5, 2025. After a comprehensive evaluation, auditors recommended the continued maintenance of PCSO’s certification, affirming that its charity and gaming operations comply with internationally recognized quality management standards. This achievement highlights PCSO’s dedication to consistent, high-quality public service and reinforces trust in its mission to serve the Filipino people.

5. PCSO Achieves World Lottery Association (WLA) Level 3 Responsible Gaming Certification

PCSO achieved WLA Level 3: Planning and Implementation Responsible Gaming Accreditation following the favorable recommendation of the Independent Assessment Panel (IAP), which evaluated the agency’s Responsible Gaming practices submitted on September 30, 2025.

This recognition affirms that PCSO has established structured, measurable, and organization-wide mechanisms to promote safe play, safeguard players, and mitigate risks associated with gaming. The Level 3 accreditation underscores PCSO’s sustained commitment to transparent, fair, and socially accountable gaming, aligned with its mandate to generate funds for health programs, medical assistance, and other charitable causes.

V. Customer Feedback Mechanisms

The 8888 Hotline is a mechanism that facilitates the timely receipt and resolution of public inquiries, complaints, suggestions, and commendations, contributing to continuous service improvement. As part of its commitment to transparency, accessibility, and responsiveness, PCSO actively utilizes the 8888 Citizens’ Complaint Center Hotline to address public inquiries and complaints from the general public.

A. 8888 Hotline

PCSO attained a 100% responsiveness and timeliness rate in addressing concerns received through the 8888 Citizens’ Hotline, demonstrating the Agency’s continued commitment to transparency, accountability, and effective public engagement.
